able Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. at the Career Planning Center, McKinney Center.

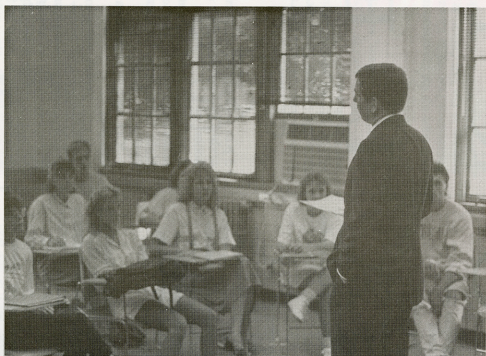
