FINAL EXAMS will begin at 7:30 a.m. Tuesday. Finals and the fall semester will end at 9 p.m. Friday.

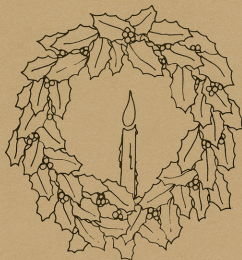
THE RUGBY CLUB will hold an organizational meeting at 4 p.m. today in 121 Violette Hall. All students are invited to the meeting.
