## Magruder and Ross Share Honors

President Jack Magruder and Sidney Ross, vice president for academic affairs and dean at the Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine, were chosen to receive the University's 1997 Distinguished Alumni Award for Excellence in the Advancement of Chemistry. Magruder and Ross both graduated from Truman in 1955 with bachelor's degrees in chemistry.

Magruder earned his master's degree in chemistry and science education from the University of Northern Iowa and his doctorate in chemistry and science education from the University of Northern Colorado.

Prior to his presidency, Magruder served on the chemistry faculty for 22

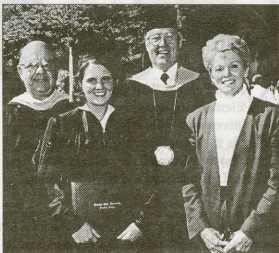
years, which included serving as head of the Division of Science. Ross earned his doctorate from KCOM. He served a post-doctorate fellowship in thoracic surgery in Japan and a second fellowship in peripheral vascular surgery at Mt. Sinai Hospital in New York. He has served on the KCOM faculty since 1986 and is the past chairperson of the department of surgery.

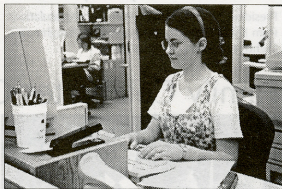
## Notables
