DR. PHYLLIS MULLENIX, an instructor in the Department of Neuropathology of Harvard Medical School in Boston, will deliver the Spring Commencement address at 10 a.m. Friday in Stokes Stadium. The 1970 magna cum laude graduate of NMSU returns to her hometown where she completed a B.S. in Zoology. The traditional academic procession will begin at 9:30 a.m. Friday with approximately 70 graduate and 690 undergraduate students marching from Baldwin Auditorium to Stokes Stadium. Enroute, the procession will travel to the quadrangle where the undergraduate student with the highest grade point average will lay a wreath at the foot of a statue of Joseph Baldwin, the University's founder and first president. During the Commencement exercises, University President Charles J. McClain will confer degrees upon the candidates. The Rev. Stephen McShane, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, will deliver the invocation and benediction. All candidates for graduation should assemble in Baldwin Auditorium at 8:30 a.m. In case of rain, Commencement exercises will be held in Pershing Arena.

THE BOARD OF REGENTS will meet at 2:15 p.m. Friday in the President's Office/Board Room, Administration/Humanities Building.

THE TRADITIONAL PINNING CEREMONY of graduates of the Nursing Division will be at 7:30 tonight in the Activities Room of the Student Union Building. Guest speaker will be Mrs. Dee Troester, coordinator of developmental programs in family and child counseling for the Kirksville Regional Center for the Developmentally Disabled-Missouri Department of Health.

GRADUATES desiring news of their graduation to be sent to their hometown news media should complete a news release form. They should be returned to the Public Relations Office in McKinney Center. Release forms and photographs, if desired, should be submitted by 4:30 p.m. today. All releases will be mailed to hometown media after Commencement.

THE SCHWENDEL-LINCOLN COLLECTION is currently featured in the Special Collections Room located on the 2nd floor of Pickler Memorial Library. Viewing hours are from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1-5 p.m. today and from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Friday.

A COMMENCEMENT LUNCHEON will be served cafeteria style from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building. Complete luncheon will be \$2.25. Children's menu will be \$1.25. Large salad plate will be \$1.25. No reservations are needed.

FINAL EXAMINATIONS will end at 9 tonight.

FIFTEEN ROTC CADETS will be honored at a Commissioning Ceremony at 1:30 p.m. Friday in the Quiet Lounge of the Student Union Building. Upon graduation from the University, the cadets will be commissioned as second lieutenants in the U.S. Army. Everyone is invited to attend the ceremony.

THE STUDENT UNION BUILDING will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday during the Spring Interim Session. The Student Union Building will be closed on weeknights and weekends with the exception of special events. This new schedule goes into effect Friday.

ALL HALL RESIDENTS should vacate the residence halls by Saturday morning. Residence halls will officially close at 10 a.m.
