**For Season Tickets:** must present faculty/staff ID at the Athletic Ticket Office, Pershing Building 213. Season tickets are available Aug. 24-Sept. 4. Tickets are \$5 per season ticket. Each ticket covers seven home games.

**For Single Game Tickets (general admission):** must present faculty/staff ID at the Athletic Ticket Office, Pershing Building 213, Monday through Friday, the week of the game or at the "Will Call" window at Stokes Stadium on the day of the game. Each faculty/staff member may receive two free tickets per game.

**For Single Game Tickets (reserved seats):** same as for general admission, except there is a \$1 charge per ticket.

—Tickets are to be picked up at the ticket office. There are no ticket deliveries, nor will any tickets be sent by campus mail.

—Anyone wanting to have someone else obtain tickets for them needs to send their faculty/staff ID along.

—Reserved seats and season tickets for faculty/staff will be located in Section B. The ticket distribution order will be season tickets first, followed by single game reserved, beginning on the 50 yard line.

—Children that will be taking up a seat require a ticket.
