## BULLETIN BOARD

**EASTER BREAK BEGINS** at 7:30 a.m. Thursday. Administrative offices will be open Thursday, however, they will be closed Friday. Offices reopen April 20. Classes resume at 7:30 a.m. April 21.

**LAST DAY TO DROP ANY COURSE** is April 24. Students must complete a drop slip, have it signed by their advisers and return it to the Registrar's Office, 104 Administration/Humanities Building. A \$5 fee is assessed for all dropped courses.

**GRADUATION PAPERS ARE DUE APRIL 24.** All placement papers, clearance forms and graduation application forms are due for graduates and undergraduates receiving degrees this spring.
