Conference Features Ann Howard



Ann Howard, president of the Leadership Research Institute, Inc., is the keynote speaker for the 1988 Fall Leadership Conference. Howard will speak Thursday, in Baldwin Auditorium on "Liberal Arts Education: The Gateway to Leadership" at 7 p.m. The Leadership Research Institute, Inc. is a nonprofit organization dedicated to research on the selection and development of leaders and managers. Howard has authored numerous journal articles, books and book chapters dealing with such topics as career issues, assessment and management motivation.

NOTES

- **Student parking decals** for 1988-89 are now on sale at the Cashier's Window in A/H. Faculty-staff parking decals for 1988-89 are available at Safety and Security. The vehicle license number will be needed to complete forms for each vehicle registered. Students must park their vehicles in the appropriate lots designated by the particular color-coded decals. Commuter students park in blue-coded lots; residential students park in green-coded lots. Vehicles parked on University-owned ground from 7 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday through Friday, must be registered no later than Sept. 16. Cost is \$7.
