CUT-OFF DATES FOR STATE APPROPRIATED FUNDS...The State's Office of Administration has advised the University concerning a number of cut-off dates which are pertinent to the State fiscal year-end accounting and procurement procedures. In order for the University Business Office to encumber and process requisitions to the State Purchasing Office by the due dates, requisitions of \$200 or more (items must be bid) must be in the Business Office no later than May 3. Also, requisitions of \$200 or more for items on State contract must be in the Business Office no later than June 2. Requisitions under \$200 for items on State contract must be in the Business Office no later than June 16.

The Business Office asks that Divisions analyze their budgets carefully and immediately submit requisitions for those items which they plan to purchase this fiscal year.

FACULTY PARTICIPATION IN COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE..Faculty Senate members and AAUP division representatives will meet Wednesday at 3:30 p.m. in the meeting room of the SUB to complete an AAUP questionnaire on "Faculty Participation in College and University Governance."

The Ford Foundation has provided the National AAUP with funds for a restudy of faculty roles in the government of four-year colleges and universities patterned on the study done by the AAUP in 1969-70. The data from the original study will be compared with responses of the restudy, the only significant difference being an ACBIS publication which will not identify individual institution responses.
