What the Government will do for you: When a door-to-door salesman talks you into a purchase, and you later change your mind there is a way to halt the transaction. The Trade Regulation Rule Concerning A Cooling Off Period For Door-To-Door Sales allows you to cancel the order within three days of the sale, if your purchase is worth \$25.00 or more. Obtain a copy of the rule from Legal and Public Records, FTC 6th and Pennsylvania Avenue, Washington D.C. 20580.

To make a pound of ground beef go further, add one grated raw potato to one pound of ground beef and mix well before forming into patties and cooking.
