Several NMSU faculty and staff have received recognition for various achievements. In the Science Division, Robert Cornell had two manuscripts accepted for publication in "American Journal of Physiology," "Gut-Derived Endotoxin Elicits Hepatotropic Factor Secretion for Liver Regeneration" and "Restriction of Gut-Derived Endotoxin Impairs DNA Synthesis for Liver Regeneration." Cornell had his work, "Endogenous Gut-Derived Bacterial Endotoxin Tonicly Primes Pancreatic Secretion of Insulin in Normal Rats," published in "Diabetes." In **Practical Arts**, an article, "Servicing the E30 Series from NAP," by Stan Vittetoe, was published in the August issue of "Electronic Servicing and Technology," a national magazine for professional electronic servicemen. Marlow Ediger of the Education Division, will speak on "The Old Order Amish" and "The Middle East," at the National Council of Social Studies convention in Baltimore.
