John Ishiyama, associate professor of political science, and Matthew Velten, a senior political science major from St. Louis, had their article "Presidential Power and Democratic Development in Post Communist Politics" accepted for publication in *Communist and Post-Communist Studies*. The article will appear in the September issue of the journal.

**Betty McLane-Iles, professor of French,** attended the International Congress of Francophone Studies, (CIEF) in Moncton, New Brunswick, Canada, May 24-30. She presented a paper titled "L'Etude des aspects internationaux des films de François Truffaut."
