The wagon roads are fine most all of them are paved,

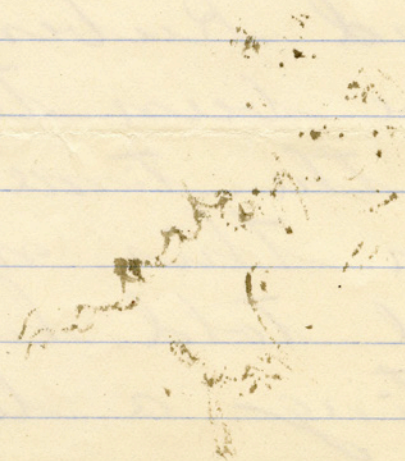
fences they are out of date or havent come in stile i do not know which

 is getting dark

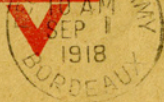

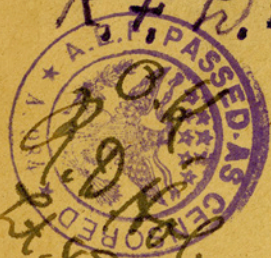
