## STUDENT DIES IN SLEEP

Mike Gensing, a 21-year old NMSU student from Palatine, Ill., died in his sleep, Dec. 2.

Gensing was discovered dead around 8:30 a.m., when his roommates tried to awaken him. The reason for his death is unknown. An autopsy was conducted at KOMC and samples have been sent to Columbia for further investigation.

Gensing was a senior math major and a four-year member of the NMSU golf team. He resided at 511 S. Elson Street in Kirksville.
