"SHE STOOPS TO CONQUER," an 18th century English comedy by Oliver Goldsmith, will be presented by the University Players at 8 tonight through Saturday in the Little Theatre of Baldwin Hall. The play, considered to be a masterpiece of the English theatre, centers around a parental matchmaking which leads to misunderstanding between lovers and a situation further complicated by a house full of inept servants. Admission is \$2 for adults, \$1 for children, or free with an NMSU ID.
