PHI DELTA KAPPA SCHOLARSHIPS ... The University's chapter of Phi Delta Kappa, national education honorary, is accepting applications for its annual undergraduate and graduate scholarships, according to Emil Green, scholarship committee member.

The undergraduate scholarship covers residence enrollment fees for two semesters. A non-resident student may be awarded the scholarship but the amount will be that of the enrollment fee for a resident student. The graduate scholarship also covers enrollment fees for two semesters.

Undergraduate applicants must be candidates for the bachelor of science in education degree and have a 3.00 grade point average with a minimum of 64 credit hours. Applicants for the graduate scholarship must be seniors or graduate students and have an undergraduate grade point average of 3.00. They must be working toward the master's degree in education.
