"WALK IN THEIR SHOES" will be the Commencement address given by Robert P. Ewing, president of Bankers Life and Casualty Company. The 1948 alumnus will speak at commencement exercises at 7:30 p.m. Friday in Stokes Stadium. In case of rain, the ceremony will be moved to Pershing Arena.

All candidates for graduation should assemble at 6:15 p.m. Friday in Baldwin Auditorium for announcement of honors. At 7 p.m. the traditional academic procession will begin.

LAST DAY of classes and final examinations have been moved to Thursday instead of Friday as previously scheduled. All grades for students not graduating must be submitted to the Registrar by 9 a.m. Friday.

RESIDENCE HALLS WILL CLOSE at noon on Saturday. All students should be moved out by that deadline. Halls will reopen at 10 a.m. Saturday, August 20, for the fall semester.

Students with fall room assignments may move their belongings into those rooms from 7 to 9 p.m. today.

PICKLER MEMORIAL LIBRARY will close at 5 p.m. Thursday instead of 10 p.m. The library will continue to be open from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. It will resume its regular semester schedule on Tuesday, August 23, from 8 a.m. to 12 midnight.

SUMMER HOURS for University offices will continue to be from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. through next week. On Monday, Aug. 22, regular semester hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. will be resumed.

COUNSELING AND TESTING will be moving to a new location on Wednesday. Director Robert Wright, Mike Hughes, and Linda Parsons will move to Room 103 of the Administration/Humanities Building.

Other staff members, including Veteran's Representative Larry Rackers, will move to the 1st floor, west end, of Blanton Hall.

SUMMER GRADUATES desiring news of their graduation to be sent to their hometown news media should complete a news release form, available in the Public Relations Office in the McKinney Center. Release forms and photographs, if desired, should be submitted by 4:30 p.m. Friday. All releases will be mailed to hometown news media after graduation ceremonies.

GRADUATES are urged to return their Placement Cards to the Placement Office before leaving campus. All graduates seeking employment through the Placement Office will need to inform the office of their current address.

GRADUATION ANNOUNCEMENTS can be picked up at the Dean of Instruction's Office, Baldwin Hall, from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Graduates are entitled to ten invitations as a part of their graduation fees. Additional invitations can be bought for 20¢ each or six for \$1. Students must present a graduation fees receipt in order to receive their invitations.
