LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CORRECTIONS MAJORS who are sophomores, juniors, or seniors, and have taken at least one course in Law Enforcement may apply for Law Enforcement Education Program (LEEP) pre-service funds. The funds, which provide for reimbursement of tuition, are available to students that are not now employed in some criminal justice agency and did not receive LEEP funds last spring or summer. LEEP funding is also available to in-service returning and transfer students, and is the same as last year.

Three Northeast cheerleaders received performance ribbons and a spirit stick from a cheerleading workshop held Aug. 13-17 at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. Squad Captain Michele McKenna, a junior from Hannibal; Barbara Wroblewski, a senior from Cedar Rapids; and Patti Barry, a junior from Creve Coeur; won one outstanding, one excellent, and four superior ribbons for their cheers.

The Mass Communication Program was recently granted membership in the American Society of Journalism School Administrators. Northeast now becomes one of 123 colleges and universities that meets the criteria for membership and was one of seven schools admitted for the 1978-79 school year. Membership requirements include evidence of institutional interest in support of mass communication, letters of support of the program by professional media personnel in the northeast Missouri area, and data concerning the professional positions held by mass communication graduates.
