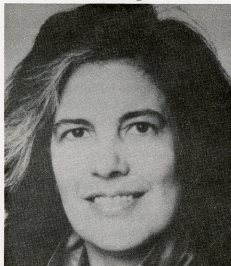

Susan Sontag, fiction writer and essayist, is the keynote speaker for the 1987 Fall Leadership Conference. Sontag will be on campus Saturday to present a reading at 11 a.m., in Baldwin Hall Little Theater and a lecture at 6:30 p.m., in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. At 2 p.m., she will be in the Campus Bookstore for book signing. The lectures and book signing are free and open to the public.

The Snack Bar, located on the second floor of the Student Union Building will begin regular hours Sunday. Hours are 10 a.m.-7 p.m., Sunday; 7 a.m.-8 p.m., Monday through Friday; and 9 a.m.-7 p.m., Saturday.

The Games Room in the SUB will be open 9:30 a.m.-9 p.m., Monday through Friday, 10 a.m.-9 p.m., Saturday, and noon-9 p.m., Sunday.

Tennis courts are available for student use at no charge. Courts are located just south of Campbell Apartments and behind Pershing Arena.

Library hours for the rest of the week are 7:30 a.m.-5 p.m., through Friday. The library will be closed on Saturday and Sunday. Starting Aug. 24, fall hours for the library are 8 a.m.-midnight, Monday through Thursday; 8 a.m.-10 p.m., Friday; 1-10 p.m., Saturday; and 1 p.m.-midnight, Sunday.

Resident Safety Patrol positions are available for the 1987-88 academic year. Students must live on campus, have a 2.5 minimum GPA, and be able to work six to nine hours weekly. Workers are scheduled midnight-3 a.m., weekdays and 1-4 a.m., weekends. Applications are available in the Residence Life Office, A/H 101. Deadline is Sept. 7.

Residence halls will open for incoming freshmen from 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m., today. Students can check in and receive keys at that time. Returning students can move in between 1-6 p.m., Saturday and from 11 a.m.-6 p.m., Sunday. Meals will be served in the residence halls beginning today at 11 a.m. The cafeterias will be closed Sunday evenings throughout the school year. Regular cafeteria hours will begin Aug. 24. Valid meal cards must be presented at each meal.

The Natatorium is tentatively scheduled to open Aug. 24. Resurfacing of the gym floor is currently in progress and is scheduled to be finished Aug. 31. Therefore, all facilities in the Pershing Building are closed until further notice.

SAB stickers will be sold at the SAB movie Friday night, at the Video Dance Sunday night and in the SAB Office, SUB, starting Aug. 25. Cost is \$10 and entitles the owner to free attendance at all SAB Friday night movies and discounts on all other SAB events.

The Student Activities Board will hold an informational meeting for freshmen from 7-8 p.m., Sept. 2 and 3, in the SUB Activities Room. All interested freshmen are encouraged to attend.

The Campus Bookstore will be open from 8 a.m.-6 p.m., today and tomorrow; 8 a.m.-5 p.m., Friday; 10 a.m.-6 p.m., Saturday; and 1-5 p.m., Sunday. Beginning next week, the Bookstore hours will be extended to 8 a.m.-8 p.m.; Aug. 28, 8 a.m.-5 p.m., and Aug. 29, 10 a.m.-3 p.m.

A celebration of the Catholic Eucharist will be held at 10:15 a.m., Sunday, SUB Activities Room. The event is sponsored by the Newman Center, a Catholic student organization.

The Student Health Clinic will shorten its hours to 1-4 p.m., Thursday and Friday. Regular hours will resume Aug. 24, from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Students are charged \$2 per visit.

Vehicle registration forms and parking maps are available at the Cashier's Window or at Safety and Security. Student parking stickers can be purchased at the Cashier's Window from 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m. weekdays. Students must park their vehicles in the appropriate lots designated by the particular color-coded sticker. Commuter students park in blue-coded lots, residential students in green-coded lots. All motor vehicles parked on University-owned ground from 7 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday through Friday, must be registered with Safety and Security no later than Sept. 4. Cost is \$7 and \$1 for each additional vehicle.

Bicycles are to be parked only in the bike racks, which are located near all residence halls and buildings on campus. Bikes used on University property can be registered with Safety and Security at no cost to the students.
