NMSU'S SEVENTH ANNUAL ENGLISH EDUCATION WORKSHOP, Creative Teaching of the Basics of English, will be held Tuesday, May 31 through Saturday, June 4 in Violette Hall 120. The workshop is designed for language arts teachers from Middle School through Junior College. Presentations by consultants, small group discussion sessions, and individual and group work sessions will be included in the workshop format. In addition, several speakers and consultants have been scheduled. Directors for this year's workshop are Hubert T. Moore, Jr. and Everett S. Porter of the Division of Language and Literature.
