THE COUNCIL ON TEACHER EDUCATION together with the Graduate Council will be mailing out a questionnaire this week to all students. The survey will serve as an evaluation instrument in preparation for the accreditation of teacher education programs. Student responses shall be used to assist in establishing the credentials of NMSU with the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). Though much of the information is primarily for use in the NCATE study, the survey gives all students an opportunity to provide input toward improving NMSU programs.
