All freshman students who are receiving university scholarships, a non-resident Missouri income tax credit, Pell grants, SEOG grants, Perkins loans, nursing loans, vocational rehabilitation credit, or ROTC credit must sign a letter-of-credit to verify the credit during the week of Aug. 24-28. Letters-of-credit are located at the tables in the hallway outside of the Business Office, McClain Hall 105. Private scholarships are distributed through the Cashier's Window (McClain Hall 105). Stafford loans for freshmen will be released Sept. 23.

Students who need an extension of the Aug. 31 due date for the first fall installment must request this extension in person at the Business Office, McClain Hall 105.

Students who need parking stickers are encouraged to purchase them by mail. Applications are available outside the Cashier's Window, McClain Hall 105. Mail the completed application (front and back) with your \$7 check or drop it in the Cashier's mail slot. Your sticker will be mailed to your local address. Please do not send cash.
