THE FIRST FEE INSTALLMENT is due at 4 p.m. Friday, Sept. 2, at the Business Office Cashier's Window, 105 Administration/Humanities Building. Failure to pay fees by the due date will result in disenrollment from fall 1983 courses. Limited credit is available. If you need a short term extension, please inquire at the Business Office before Sept. 2.

THE NEW STUDENT WELCOME PICNIC is from 6-7:30 p.m., Sunday, in Red Barn Park. All faculty and staff members are invited to attend. Free tickets will be available to faculty and staff members at the park.

THE ACTIVITIES FAIR is an opportunity for both new and returning students to explore the different types of organizations and opportunities to participate in campus activities. The event is sponsored by Cardinal Key honorary sorority and will be held Sept. 22 from 7:30-10 p.m. in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building.

SAB PASSES will be available beginning Monday in the Student Activities Board Office on the second floor of the Student Union Building. The passes are \$10 and admit holders to weekly SAB movies free as well as offering other entertainment opportunities either free or at discount prices.

RESIDENCE HALL TELEPHONES have the following special features:

LOCAL LINES—You can gain access to an outside (Kirksville) phone line by dialing "9." (See also Trunk Queuing)

TRUNK QUEUING—Trunk Queuing allows you to be placed in a waiting line if all the University's outside lines are busy. When an outside line becomes free, you will be called back automatically with three quick, distinct rings. You do **not** have to dial "9" again.

LONG DISTANCE—Reach a long-distance operator by dialing 66-0—the number to be reached. You can make collect calls, credit card calls and calls charged to a third number from your residence hall phone.

THREE-WAY CALLS—By quickly depressing the switchhook while on a two-party call, you can put them on hold and dial a third party to be added to the conference call. When you depress the switchhook a second time, the party on hold joins you and the third person for a three-way conversation.

CALL WAITING—If someone should try to call you while your line is busy, you will hear a tone indicating someone else is trying to reach you. You may either continue talking or hang up, in which case the phone will ring again. The third person will not hear the busy signal.

DIRECTORY ASSISTANCE—You cannot get directory assistance from your room phone. You can get assistance from a coin phone; your coin will be returned after the call.

A FRATERNITY RUSH ASSEMBLY will be held at 7 p.m., Tuesday, in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. The assembly is free and provides information for men interested in pledging a fraternity. The rush registration fee is \$1. There will be a second meeting Sept. 12, and pledge sign-up will be Sept. 15.

OLD-TIME MOVIE FAVORITES will be shown at 7 p.m. Monday in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. The movies, sponsored by the Student Activities Board, are free.

DANCE from 7:30-10 p.m. Monday at a free dance on the Student Union Mall. The event is sponsored by the Student Activities Board and KNEU, the campus radio station.

TELEPHONE SWITCHBOARD HOURS are from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily.

MEET THE PRESIDENTS at 5:30 p.m. Sunday in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. University President Charles J. McClain and Student Senate President Kevin Smith will welcome new students to campus with a brief program before adjourning for the New Student Picnic at 6 p.m. in Red Barn Park.

POOL HOURS for the fall semester will be 6:30-9:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and from 10 a.m. until 1:45 p.m. on Saturdays. Swimming for faculty only will be held from 11:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

SWIMMERS AND DIVERS interested in trying out for the men's or women's varsity swim teams should attend the meeting scheduled for Tuesday at 4 p.m. in the spectator area of the pool.

RACQUETBALL COURTS are available in Pershing Arena each day. Sign up in the equipment room by 7:30 a.m. on the morning you want a court. Go in person, no phone calls will be accepted.

STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE applications may be picked up at the Student Health Clinic or the Business Office. The cost of this basic health insurance plan is \$99 for the calendar year.

SORORITY RUSH SIGN-UP will be held from 10:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Sept. 7-9 in Ryle Hall, Centennial Hall, and on the Concourse of the Student Union Building.

USED BOOKS will be sold by the Veterans Club beginning Monday and continuing through Friday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Activities Room of the Student Union Building. Books will be bought and sold Monday through Wednesday. Books will continue to be sold and money can be picked up Thursday and Friday.

GOT THE MUNCHIES? The Snack Bar in the Student Union Building can satisfy almost any appetite. Regular hours are from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Sunday.

THE CAMPUS BOOKSTORE in the Student Union Building will be open from noon to 4 p.m. this Saturday and from 1-4 p.m. this Sunday only for students who want to get a headstart on book-buying. Regular hours will also be extended Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The bookstore is regularly open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Fridays; and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays.

TENNIS COURTS are available just south of Campbell Apartments. There are also two courts located behind Pershing Arena for student use.
