Students may pay fees today through Friday at the Business Office, 105 Administration/Humanities Building, according to the last digit of their Social Security Numbers. Pre-registered students whose numbers end in 0 and 1 may pay this morning and this afternoon, respectively. Students registering for classes today with numbers 0 and 1 are asked to pay Tuesday morning. The schedule for remaining students is as follows: 2 and 3--Tuesday afternoon, 4--Wednesday morning, 5--Wednesday afternoon, 6--Thursday morning, 7--Thursday afternoon, 8--Friday morning and 9--Friday afternoon. The same schedule will be used for distribution of financial aid at the Business Office. The office will also be open from 7-9 p.m. today through Friday for students who cannot make it to the office during the day.

Financial aid will be applied directly to students' bills this year. This change means that checks will be issued by the Business Office only if a balance exists after the fall semester's tuition, room and board are paid for. Students receiving financial aid should go to the loan table at their appointed time before paying fees.

Meal stickers will be issued in the residence hall cafeterias during this week. The Business Office, 105 Administration/Humanities Building, will handle the stickers beginning next week. Students who live off campus may purchase a meal sticker at the Business Office.
