## Angelou Rescheduled For Thursday Night

The Lyceum Series presentation of Maya Angelou, which was scheduled for Sept. 15, has been rescheduled. Due to personal reasons, Ms. Angelou postponed her performance to 8 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 22 in Baldwin Auditorium.

Free tickets for students, faculty and staff are available in the Student Activities Board Office, SUB and at the door. Tickets obtained for the original performance will be honored.

## NOTES

- **Research assistantship information and applications** are available in the Division of Language and Literature, A/H 310. Students with a background in Spanish will investigate fields of botanical nomenclature, medieval medicine and agriculture, and linguistics.
- **The Mellon Fellowship in the Humanities** provides a renewable \$11,000 stipend, plus payment of tuition and standard fees, to seniors entering graduate school in a humanities field in fall 1989. Candidates must take the GRE-general test no later than Dec. 10 (registration deadline is Oct. 31) and file all required documents no later than Dec. 5, 1988. Further information is available through the Division of Social Science, A/H 214, 785-4636.
- **Sophomores interested in a career in government service** at the federal, state or local level are invited to apply for a 1989 Harry S. Truman Scholarship. Established by Congress in 1975, the Harry S. Truman Scholarship Foundation operates an ongoing educational scholarship program designed to provide opportunities for outstanding U.S. students with potential leadership ability to prepare for careers in government service. In April 1989, the Foundation will award 105 scholarships nationally. The deadline for all 1989 applications is Dec. 1, 1988. Northeast can nominate three students for the 1989 competition. The scholarship award covers eligible expenses up to \$7,000 per year for the junior year, the senior year and two years of graduate study. To be eligible, a student must be a full-time sophomore working toward or planning to pursue a baccalaureate degree, have a "B" average or equivalent, stand in the upper fourth of the class, and be a U.S. citizen or U.S. national heading toward a career in government. Interested students should contact Dean Terry Smith, A/H 204, for more information.
- **The Travel to Collections program** provides \$750 grants to assist American scholars in meeting the costs of long-distance travel to the research collections of libraries, archives, museums, or other repositories throughout the United States and the world. Applications submitted should be for well-designed research projects on topics of significance to the study of the humanities. The 1989 application deadlines for the program are Jan. 15 and July 15. Present guidelines and application materials will be valid through the July 15, 1989 deadline. American scholars are eligible to apply.
