Residence halls will close at 10 tonight and reopen at 10 a.m. Tuesday, April 24.

Pickler Memorial Library and the Student Union Building will be closed on weekends during break. Weekday hours will be from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. PML will return to regular hours on Tuesday, April 24. SUB will resume regular hours on Wednesday, April 25.

RESERVATIONS FOR THE 22ND ANNUAL BALDWIN LECTURE must be made today. The buffet dinner and lecture will be held at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 25, in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building. The Rev. Robert J. Henle, S.J., former president of Georgetown University and currently McDonnell professor of social justice in American society at Saint Louis University, will deliver the lecture.
