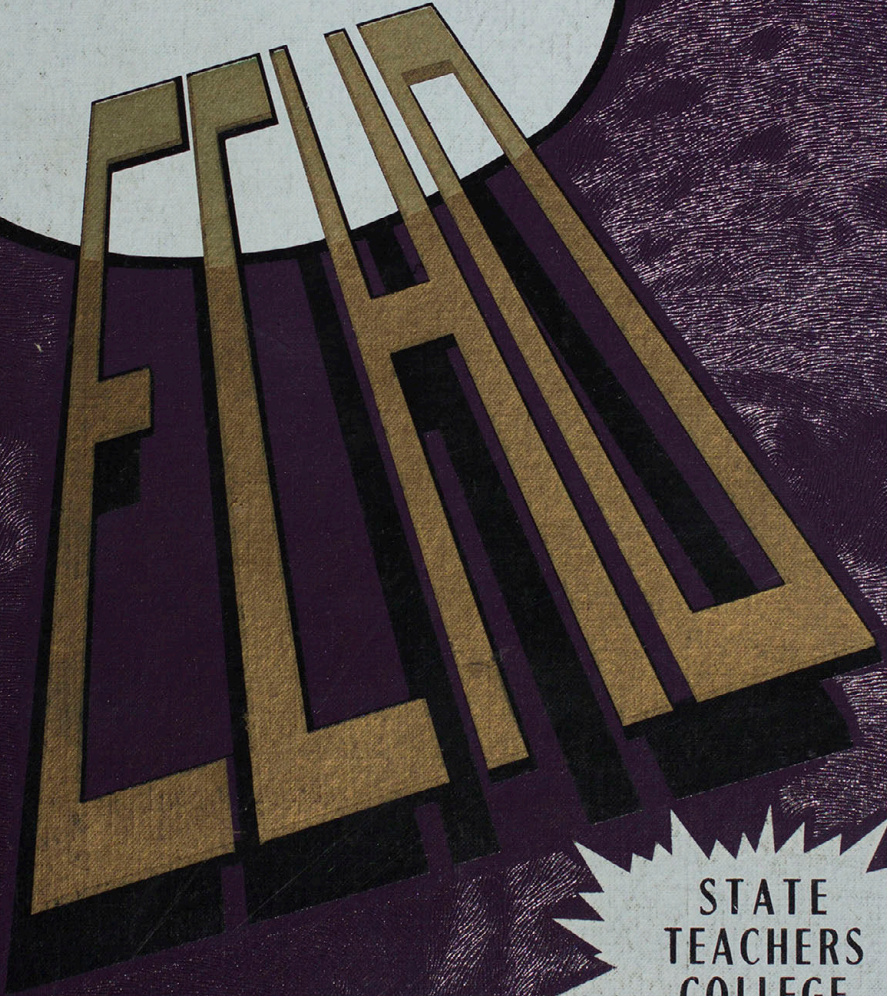
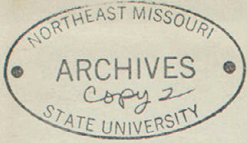

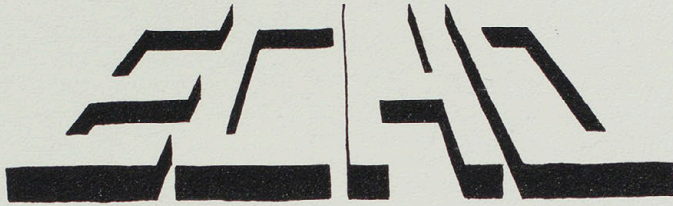

history of missouri state teachers college

The Missouri State Teachers College began its existence in September, 1867, as a private institution and was called the Northeast Missouri Normal School. It was founded by Joseph Baldwin who had been engaged in normal school work in Indiana for about ten years. It was opened in a building known at the time as Cumberland Academy. This building had been erected by the Kirksville Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church for school purposes, just at the outbreak of the Civil War. It stood in the block now known as the Memorial Park in the northeast part of Kirksville.

President Baldwin had not come to Missouri merely to establish a private normal school. He came with the definite purpose of building up an institution of such excellence as to induce the State of Missouri to make it one of a number of state normal schools. He therefore began at once to advocate a system of six normal schools in Missouri. He was joined in his campaign by several prominent educators in the state, and as a result the Legislature of Missouri enacted a law in March, 1870, providing for two state normal schools, one on either side of the Missouri River. The location of these two institutions was left to a Board of Regents.

Shortly after the Legislature passed this bill providing for two state normal schools, various counties prepared bids for the location of these institutions and submitted them to the Board of Regents. Adair and Livingston counties were active competitors for the school north of the Missouri River. On December 29, 1870, the Board of Regents accepted the bid of Adair County and located the First District Normal School at Kirksville. The faculty of the Northeast Missouri Normal School was then made the faculty of the newly created State Normal School with Joseph Baldwin as president. When the students returned to Kirksville in January, 1871, after the Christmas holidays, they returned to a state institution.

The school known in its catalogs both as the "North Missouri State Normal School" and the "Missouri State Normal School of the First District" continued to use the building, in which it had been founded as a private institution, until January, 1873, when it occupied a new building on the present campus. This old building, later known as Baldwin Hall was for nearly thirty years the only building on the campus. In 1901 Library Hall was built as a wing on the east of the main building, and in 1905 Science Hall was erected as another wing on the west. Science Hall was gutted by fire on September 18, 1918, but was rebuilt in the winter of 1918-19. At that time automatic fire doors were installed in the passageways between Baldwin Hall and Science Hall and these saved Science Hall at a later time.

The school used its official name of First District Normal School from 1905 to 1919, but it was popularly known as K.S.N.S.--the Kirksville State Normal School. Even today, old-timers speak of it under that title, or affectionately they abbreviate it to "the Normal." In 1919 it was named by the legislature the Northeast Missouri State Teachers College, which is officially its name today. In the late forties, the legislature granted to the five teachers colleges the option of dropping *teachers* from their names. The other teachers colleges of Missouri exercised this option, leaving this school as the only State Teachers College in Missouri, the title by which it is familiarly known.

In 1924 old Baldwin Hall burned completely. Library Hall went with it, since it was not as well protected as Science Hall. Insurance money and a gift from Samuel M. Pickler soon created a new library building, but the college remained without a replacement for Baldwin Hall until 1938.

President Baldwin remained with the institution until 1881 when he resigned to accept the presidency of the Sam Houston Normal Institute at Huntsville, Texas. Since that time the presidency here has been filled by V. P. Nason, pro tem, 1881-82; J. P. Blanton, 1882-91; W. D. Dobson, 1892-99; John R. Kirk, 1899-1925; Eugene Fair, 1925-37; and Walter H. Ryle, since 1937. The portraits of all the past presidents are in the first floor corridor of Baldwin Hall.

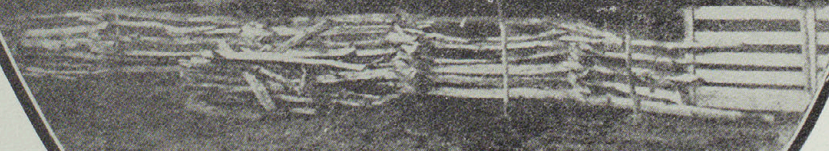
The annual enrollment of students has steadily grown from the beginning. At the end of the first year there were 140 students in what was called the normal department. In the fall of 1956 there were 1763 persons attending classes on the campus, and in the fall of 1957 the number was 2003.

The faculty has likewise grown in numbers. In the first year there were only six members on the faculty. In 1927 there were 64, and in 1957-58 there are 113 on the faculty roll, 11 of whom are on an emeritus list.

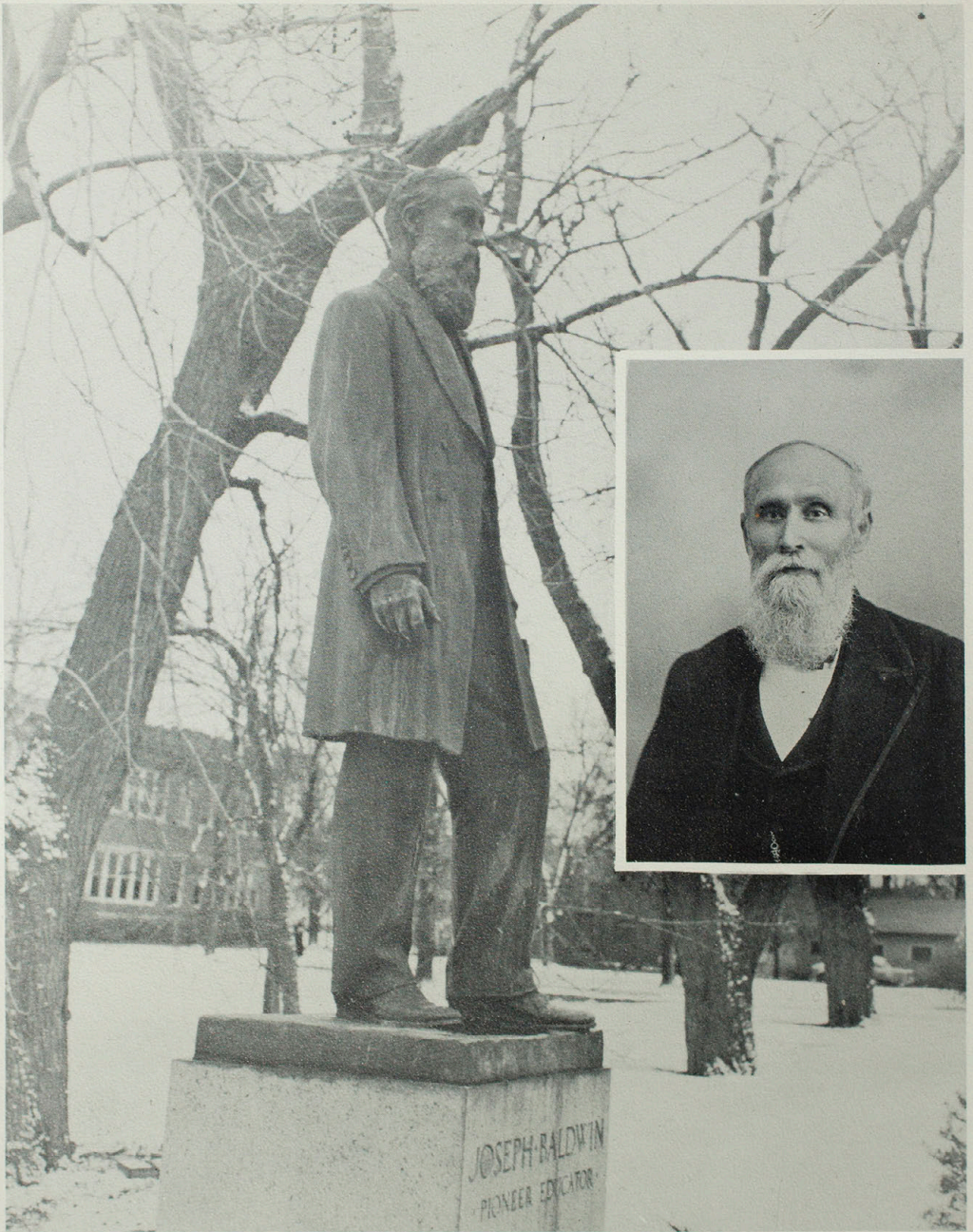
The college of 1867, as well as that of 1900, had no entrance requirements. High schools were not numerous, but when a high school graduate came to the First District Normal School, he was graduated in one or two years. If he came from the eighth grade to the Normal School, he finished in four years. Gradually between 1900 and 1915 the high school courses were added and made a prerequisite to the normal school courses. The college began issuing the Bachelor of Science in Education degree in 1912, basing four years of college on four years of high school. But until the early '20's, high school work was offered in the college. In 1947 the college announced the fifth year of work culminating in the master's degree, and in 1958 it is announcing that a five-year college program is to become the principal program.

In the history of the college, the twenty-year period from 1937 to the present has been one of plant construction. The original thirteen acres have been expanded into a forty-five acre site and the number of buildings has been greatly increased. In 1937 there existed the Pickler Library Building, Old Science Hall, Kirk Auditorium, the Ophelia Parrish School, the power plant which at one time housed the Industrial Arts department, a farm house and a barn, and the Model Rural School--a total of eight buildings. Since 1937 the Rural School has been razed, but the following buildings have been added to the seven which remained: Baldwin Hall, Ophelia Parrish Addition, Industrial Arts Building, Industrial Arts Addition, Housing Units B, C, D, E, F, G, H and K, Missou Hall, Bulldog Kennel, Practical Arts Building, Home Economics, Temporary Storage Unit, a Warehouse, Stokes Stadium Press Box, Grim Hall, Home Management House, Blanton Hall, Nason Hall, the Greenhouse, the Garage, the College Apartments, Science Hall, Kirk Memorial, and Dormitory M. Under construction in 1958--which has been named the Year of Building-- are the Auditorium in Baldwin Hall, the Pershing Building, Brewer Hall, an extension of the Power Plant, and the Fair Apartments. There will then be forty-one separate roofs.

During these years, grounds have been beautified with ornamental entranceways, a quadrangle of sidewalks, a flagpole, many beds of flowers, and a number of lawns which were previously bare spots. A hundred or more hardy trees, many of them flower-bearing, have come to maturity. Planned for the near future are parking lots and long sidewalks for the newer parts of the campus.

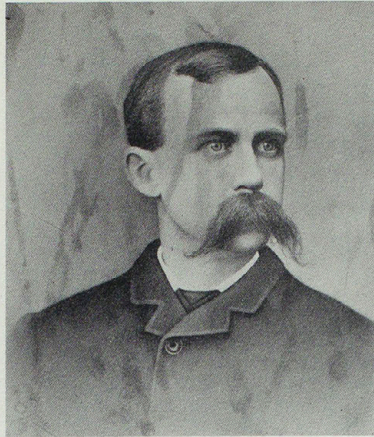


NORTH MISSOURI NORMAL SCHOOL
Founded in 1867 by Joseph Baldwin

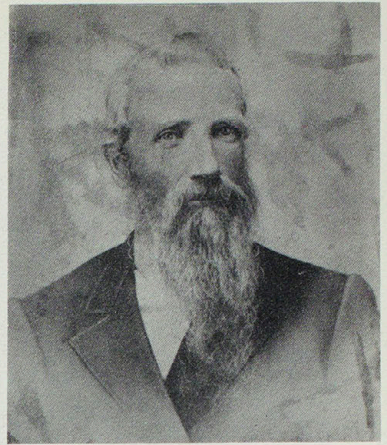

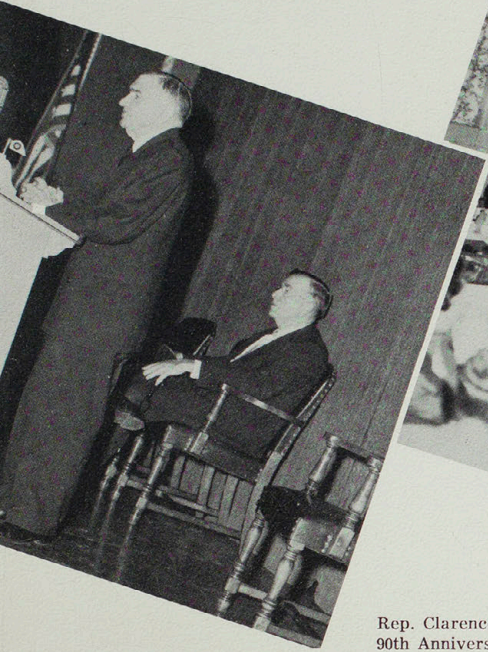

Publishing an annual to equal these occasions is a task that has not been performed without much diligent labor and deep meditation.

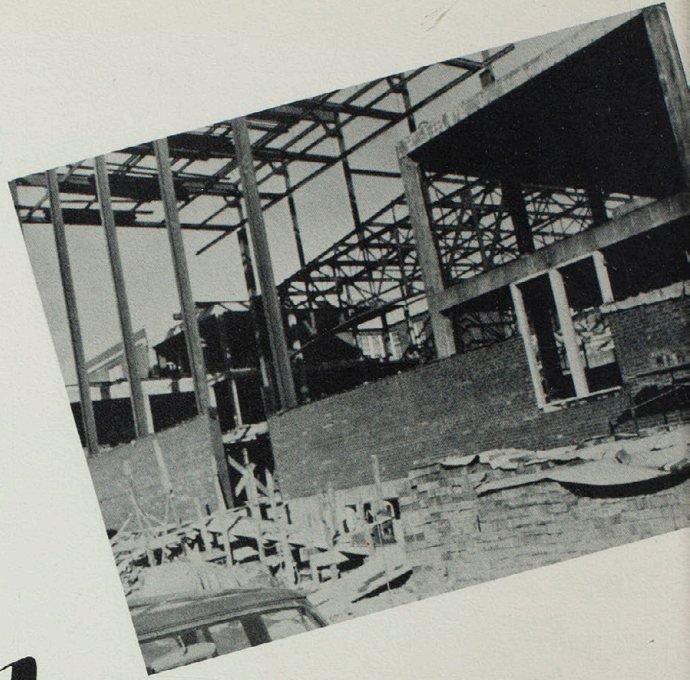
If you should discover that it is imperfect, remember that perfection is an ideal, not a reality.

It is our hope that, as you turn these pages, you will live again in memory some of our various mutual experiences.

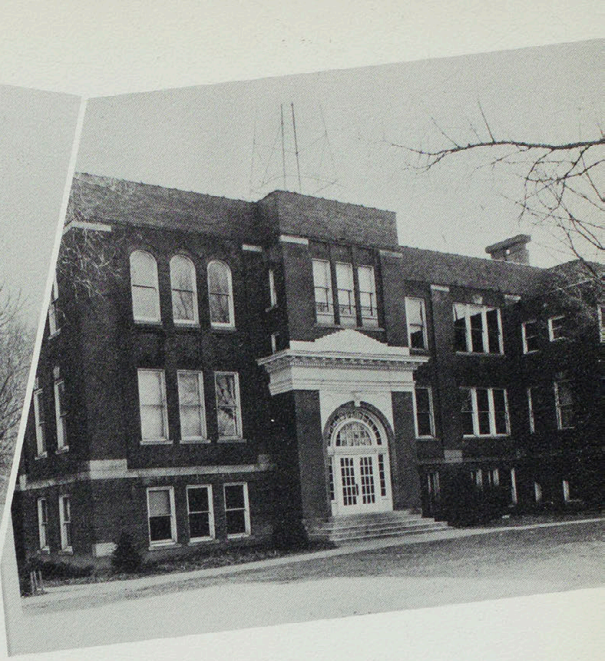

The board is made up of seven members. The State Commissioner of Education, Hubert Wheeler, by virtue of his office, is an ex-officio member.



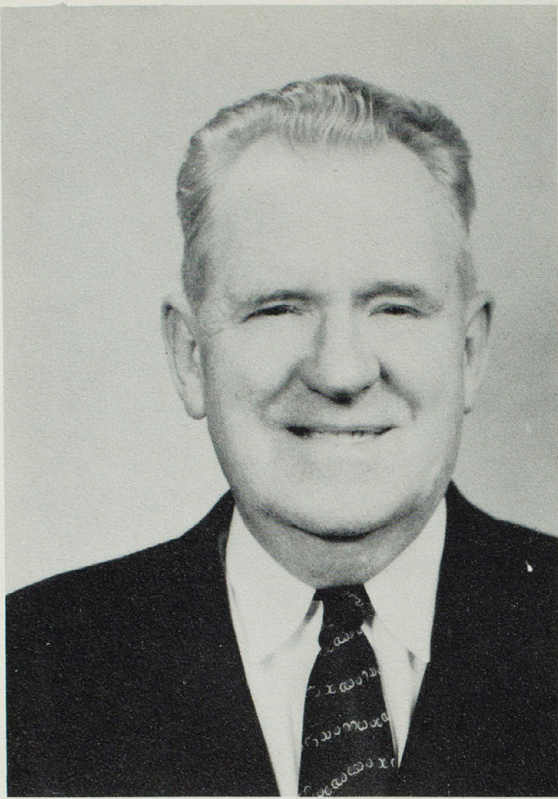

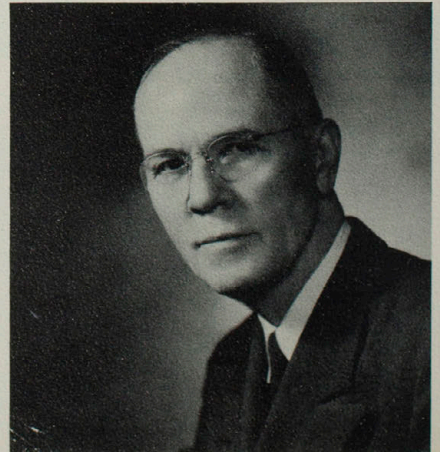
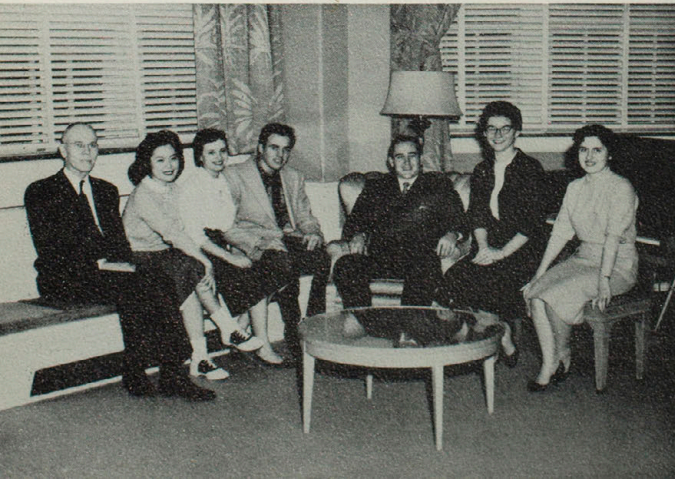
During the summer, the Council sponsors its annual street dance and other social activities for the benefit of summer quarter students. In this way the Student Council serves the student body all year long.

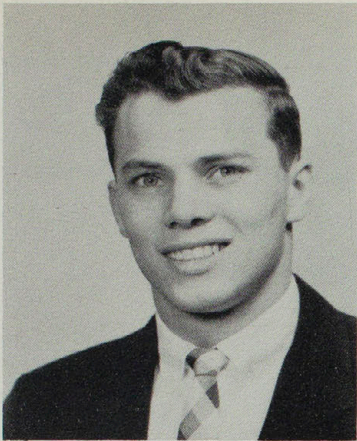

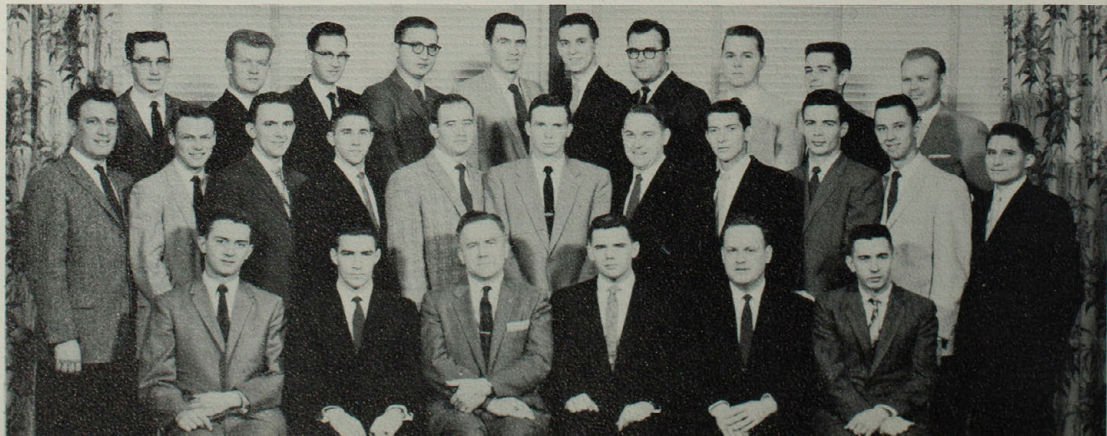
Cardinal Key is limited to twenty-five members.

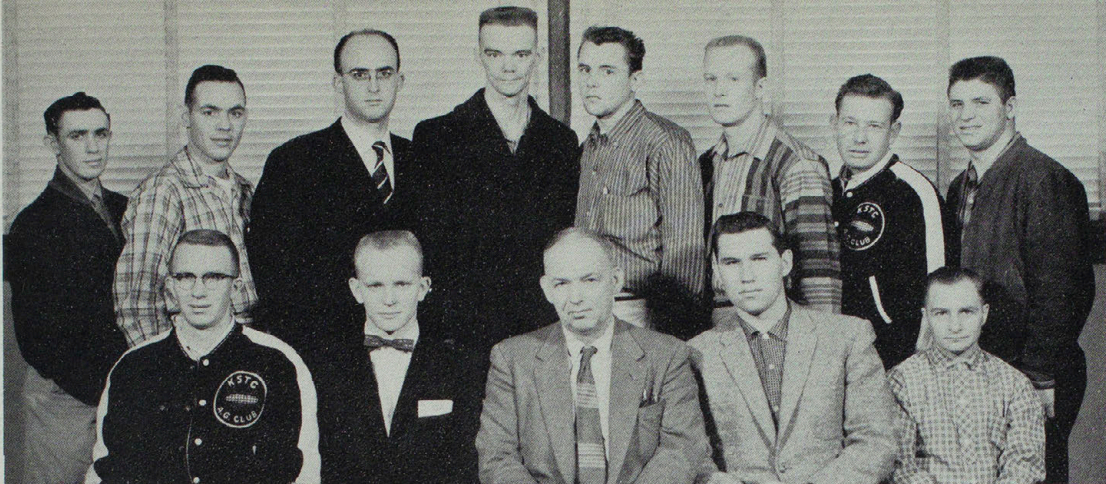
Each year Epsilon chapter sponsors a spring and a fall camporee for the scouts of the Thousand Hills

Again this spring the Ag Club will help the Agriculture Department in the District Judging Contest.

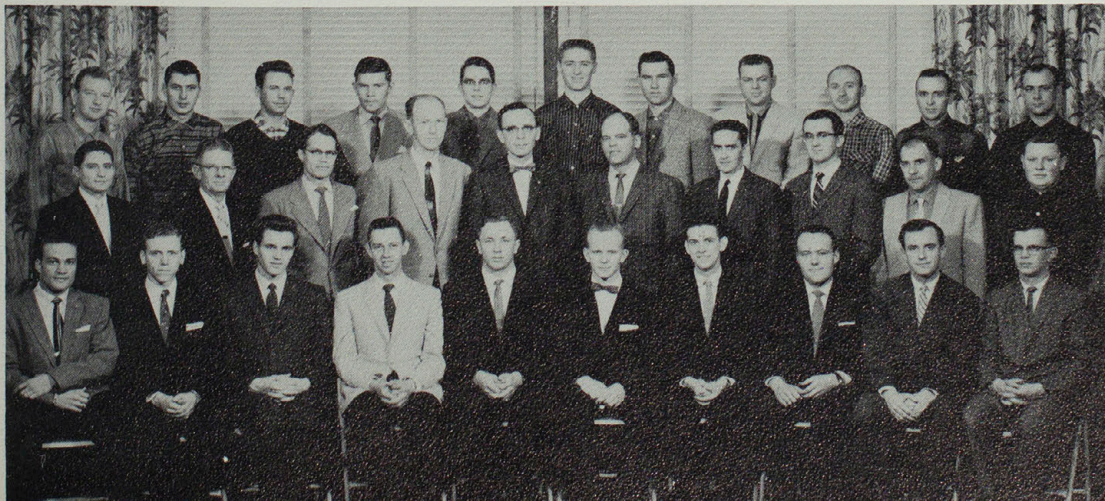
industrial arts club

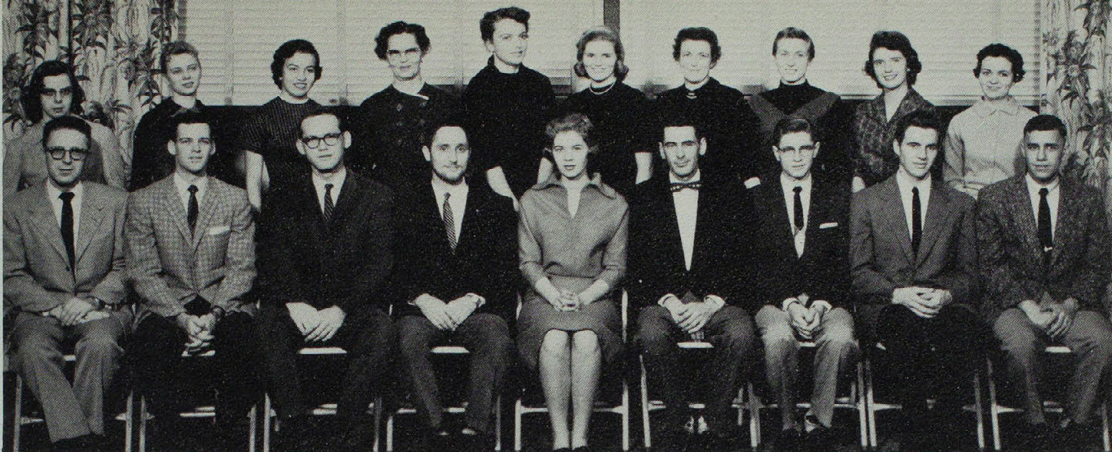

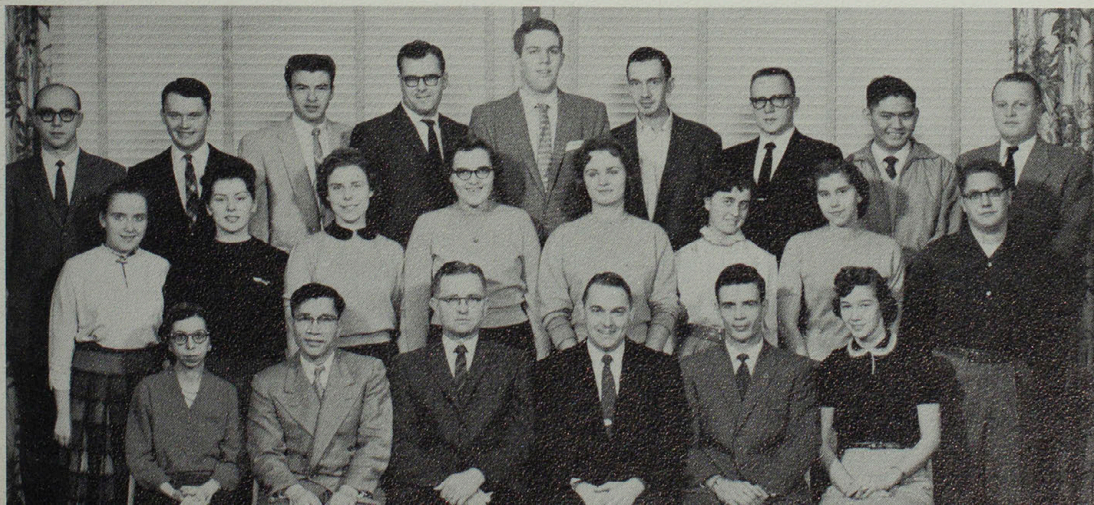

The Historical Society, which includes any Social Science major or minor, is the oldest learned society on the campus. Any student who is interested in the Social Sciences is welcome to join the Society.

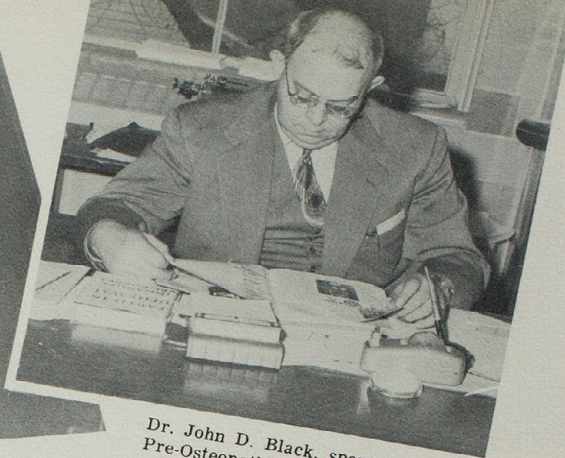

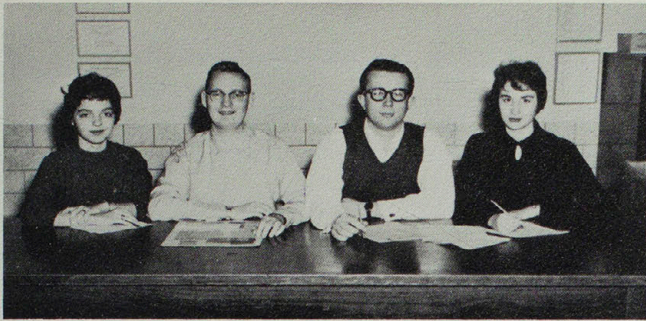

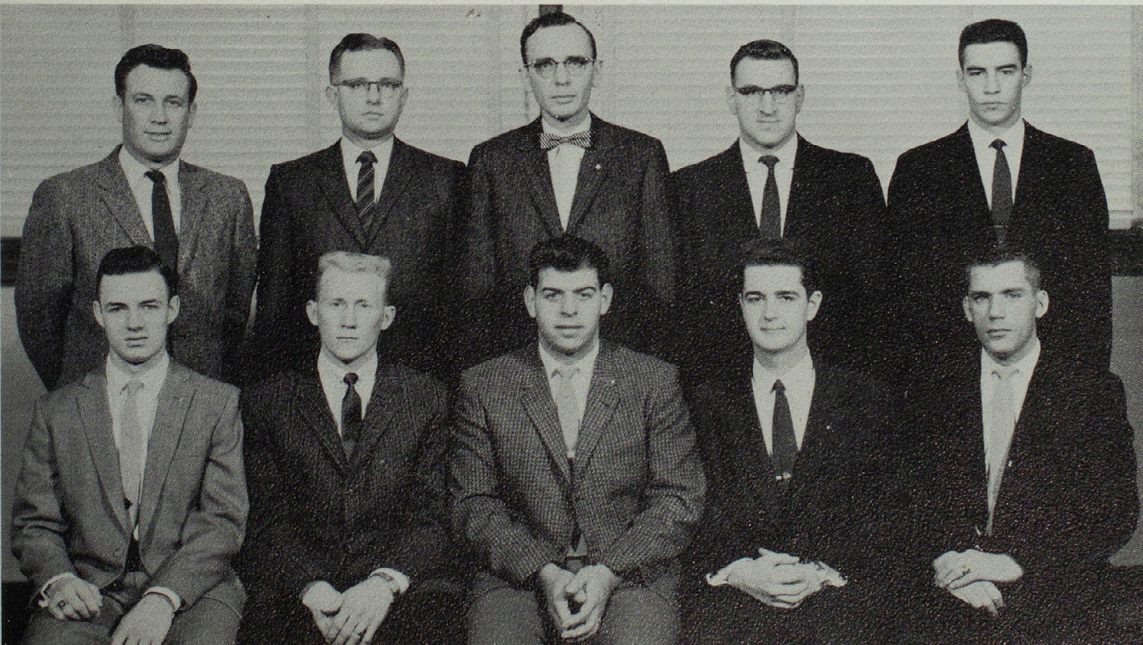

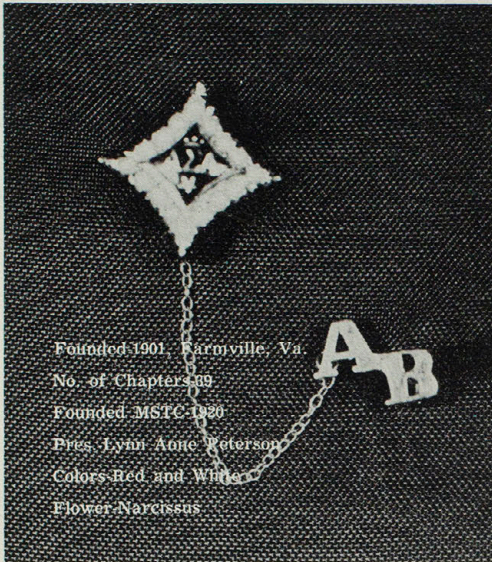

Helping engineer the fraternity again this year were sponsors Duane Cole and Dr. Karel, to whom we give sincere thanks for their fine efforts.



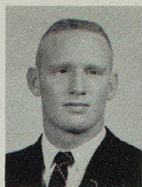

After annual rush smokers and the University rush dance, twenty-three new men pledged Alpha Kappa Lambda.

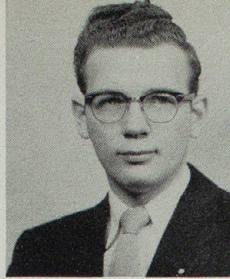

Homecoming started off this year's activities. Cita Green was Tri Sigma's candidate for Homecoming Queen, and the float, "90 Years and Still Sailing", won

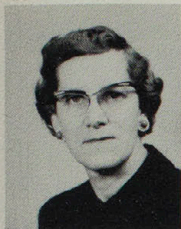
second place. Three of the Bulldog cheerleaders were Tri Sigmas.

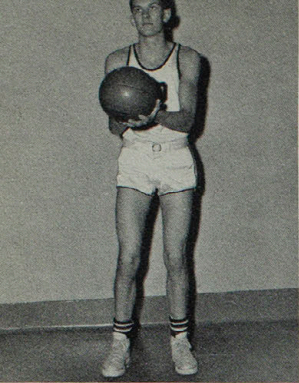
