THE UNIVERSITY'S TIME CAPSULE will be dedicated at 4 p.m. Thursday in the Conference Room of the SUB. President Emeritus Ryle, chairman of the University's Bicentennial Committee, will present the capsule to Dr. McClain. Don Wolf, Student Senate president, will preside at the ceremony. Refreshments will be served.

The capsule, to be opened on July 4, 2076, by the University's chief executive, will include such items as photographs of the Bicentennial year, the minutes of the Bicentennial Committee, the 1976 *Echo*, various University bulletins and printed programs. The capsule will be sealed in a chamber at the base of the eternal flame on the quadrangle.

SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AND COUNSELORS from more than 25 Missouri counties have been invited to participate in the fifteenth annual Conference for School Administrators and School Counselors Wednesday on campus. The conference is being sponsored by the Counseling and Testing Division.

The conference will begin with a registration and coffee hour at 9 a.m. in the Tangerine Room. Dr. John Jones, supervisor of assessment and technical consultant to the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Jefferson City, will discuss "Missouri's Educational Goals/Objectives and the Statewide Assessment Project" during the morning session. Jack Reiske of the Education Division will talk on "NMSU's Education Goals/Objectives and the University Assessment Program" in the afternoon.
