THE NEMOSINGERS CANDLELIGHT CONCERT is scheduled for 8 p.m. tomorrow in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. The performance is free and open to the public.

Clay Dawson of Fine Arts will direct the singers in a program of familiar carols and seasonal classics. As in the past, the concert will feature a candlelight processional and a narrative centering around Christmas scriptures and related texts. In keeping with the Bicentennial theme, much of the concert music will have roots in our American heritage.

THE ST. LOUIS JAZZ QUARTET, with vocalist Jeanne Trevor, is scheduled to perform at 8 p.m. tonight in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. The concert is part of the University's Lyceum Series and is free of charge to University students, faculty and staff. General admission tickets will be available at \$2 each at the door.

In addition to Jeanne Trevor, the group features Terry Kippenberger, bass and bass guitar; Ken Palmer, keyboard instruments; John DeMartino, percussionist; and Willie Akins, saxophone.

THE ANNUAL ART INTRO SHOW sponsored by the Artistic Sons of Baldwin is open in the University Gallery through Friday. The exhibition is selected by a faculty jury from works submitted by students in 100 or 200 level art courses. Helen Babbitt, William Murray and William Unger of Fine Arts were the jurors.

Regular gallery hours are 1-4 p.m. weekdays. The gallery also will be open tonight in conjunction with the Lyceum program.
