(a. 10%; b. 25%; c. 50%) 3) What fraction of the world's energy consumption occurs in the U.S.? (a. over 10%; b. over 20%; c. over 30%)

Hopefully the members of the American Association of University Women will be able to answer these and other related questions at the conclusion of their meeting on campus Feb. 14. The club is hosting Denman C. Evans, University assistant professor of science, that night for a Citizen Energy Environment Workshop. Evans is one of 65 trained scientists who are conducting the workshops

(continued from front) ... throughout the U.S. under the direction of the Energy Research and Development Administration. The workshops, which last from one to three hours in length, are given free of charge. They utilize a specially designed analog computer, an "electronic time machine," which gives the workshop participants a chance to make decisions about the allocation of energy resources and their effects on the environment and population growth.
