## Hall of Fame

Fifteen people who have made contributions to the intercollegiate sports program at Northeast will be inducted into the NMSU Hall of Fame, Sept. 29. Since the Hall of Fame was established in 1983, 83 people have been inducted.

Activities honoring the 1990 inductees will consist of recognition at a half time program during the Bulldog football game with Missouri Southern (Joplin) in the afternoon and the eighth annual banquet and formal induction ceremony in the evening. The football game will begin at 1:30 p.m. in Stokes Stadium. The banquet and ceremony, which will be hosted by the University Alumni Association, will be held at 7 p.m. in the SUB Georgian Room.

## Master of Arts in Education Deadlines

### Freshmen

Attend early school experiences meeting. Make arrangements for placements. Check with adviser or Education Division about certification requirements.

### Sophomores

Make arrangements for second early school experience placement.

### Juniors

Take Foundations of Education (ED 389) in August or January.

Take Clinical Experiences (ED 393) after the Foundations of Education course. Begin collection of data for MAE Structured Portfolio. Take GRE test in April.

### Seniors

—Take Psychological Foundations of Education. Apply for admission to MAE program by Sept. 30. File Candidacy Plan. Check with Educa-

tion Division for stipulations or applications and coursework. Placement papers are due in Career Placement Center.

**October/November**—MAE Admissions Committee interviews candidates and makes recommendations within 45 days. Provisional Acceptance/Approval granted to those recommended by Admissions Committee.

**November/December**—Register for Management of Instruction. (Check with adviser if you are seeking secondary certification; check with Education Division if you are seeking elementary or special education certification.)

**February**—Division of Education placement papers due to division office by the 15th for accepted applicants.

**March/April**—Internship sites arranged. You will receive the internship information in April, May or June.

**April/June**—Choose graduate research option.

### Pre-Internship

Take graduate courses. Apply for provisional teacher certification. Return to Violette Hall 267 K.

### Internship

Take Applied Educational Psychology. Complete application for graduation; return to Education Division. (For May graduates: research option due April 1.)

### Post-Internship

Apply for teaching certificate. For August graduates: research option due July 1. For Dec. graduates: research option due Nov. 1.
