GRADUATION NEWS RELEASES for degree candidates of 1979 Summer Commencement should be returned to the Public Relations Office, McKinney Center, before 4:30 p.m. Thursday. All releases will be mailed following commencement. Extra forms are available at McKinney Center.

FINAL EXAMS for the second summer term will be given in regularly scheduled classes Thursday.

RESIDENCE HALLS will close for the summer at 12 noon Saturday. All students should be moved out of the halls by that time. The halls will open again at 12 noon Saturday, Aug. 25.

THE COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS for Friday's graduation will be given by William D. Dye, 27-year-old director of the Missouri Division of Budget and Planning, at 7:30 p.m. in Stokes Stadium. About 165 graduate and 160 undergraduate students are expected to receive degrees. In case of rain, each student will be issued four rain tickets for the ceremony, which will be held in Baldwin Auditorium. Rain plans also include broadcasting the commencement exercises on closed circuit TV in the Little Theatre and the Student Union Building.

The Division of Language and Literature has received a \$1,250 grant from the Missouri Council on the Humanities to help fund the 2nd Midwest Writing Program Administrators Conference here Oct. 13. Shirley Morahan, Language and Literature, is project director for the grant and will organize the conference.

Jerry Vittetoe, Business, was elected treasurer of the Missouri Business Education Association at the conference held in Columbia July 24-26. More than 2,700 vocational teachers attended. Vittetoe was the group leader of an accounting roundtable titled "Articulating Accounting Instruction."

Shirley Shoemyer, business graduate, Lisa Teter, sophomore, and Kathy Parrish, senior, attended the Phi Beta Lambda National Leadership Conference July 5-8 in New Orleans. Parrish was elected national vice president for the north-central region.
