## Alumni design new University logo

When Northeast's name officially changes to Truman State University on July 1, 1996, the University will have a new logo to complement the new moniker. The new logo, designed by a team of Northeast alumni, was unveiled at the University's Board of Governor's meeting on April 13.

Soon after Gov. Mel Carnahan signed Senate Bill 340 in June 1995, changing the name of Northeast Missouri State University to Truman State University, President Jack Magruder called on four alumni designers to volunteer their talents to create the

University's new logo. All four accepted the challenge: Louis Claps, of Spindler/Claps & Associates, Ltd. in Arlington Heights, Ill.; Amy Fister of Fister Laubert, Inc. of St. Louis; Alan Harrington of Three Art, Inc. in Cedar Rapids, Iowa; and Bill Wehrman of Maritz Performance Improvement Company in St. Louis.

The designers first met with members of the University to discuss the University's mission and goals for Truman State University. Initial designs were presented to the University's Clearinghouse Committee, also appointed by Magruder, in November 1995. The committee included students, faculty, staff and alumni who

were charged with helping guide the University through the transition from Northeast to Truman. Final logo presentations were made in March 1996. After selecting a logo, the committee presented their recommendations to Magruder.

"We are most appreciative of the outstanding effort from these great designers. Their commitment and personal service to the University have provided a professional logo for Truman State University that has a classic and distinctive look and a connection to our past," Magruder said.

Changing the University's name to Truman State University coincides with the 10th anniversary of the Missouri Legislature changing Northeast's mission

from that of a regional comprehensive university to the statewide liberal arts and sciences university. The new name, Truman State University, will provide the University with a name that now complements its statewide mission.

As Missouri's premier statewide liberal arts and sciences university, Northeast/Truman has received tremendous recognition for offering a high-quality academic education at a low cost. Most recently, the University was ranked the third best buy in the nation in *Money* magazine's 1996 edition of *Money Guide: Your Best College Buys Now*.

## Latin drummer to perform

Latin percussionist Bobby Sanabria will give a lecture and recital at 7 p.m., April 29 in Ryle Hall main lounge.

New Yorker by birth, Puerto Rican by heritage, Sanabria is a multi-talented drummer/percussionist who has performed with and composed and arranged music for many of the greats in the Latin and jazz fields. He and his group, Ascension, have appeared at major jazz festivals internationally, performing with artists such as Mongo Santamaria, Tito Puente, Dizzy Gillespie, Paquito D'Rivera and Mario Bauza's Afro-Cuban Jazz Orchestra.

A 1979 graduate of Boston's Berklee College of Music, Sanabria was honored with a National Endowment for the Arts grant in 1983. He was a featured performer on *The Mambo Kings* soundtrack and *Tanga*, with Mario Bauza's Jazz Orchestra.

His television credits include a PBS documentary on the life of Mongo Santamaria and an appearance on the Bill Cosby Show.

## "The Western Hero in History and Myth"

**Noted author Paul Andrew Hutton** will speak on "The Western Hero in History and Myth," at 7 p.m., April 26, in the SUB Activities Room.

Hutton teaches history at the University of New Mexico and serves as executive director of the Western History Association. His book, *Phil Sheridan and His Army*, received the Billington Prize from the Organization of American Historians, the Evans Biography Award and the Spur Award from the Western Writers of America.

His 1991 essay on the film *Correct in Every Detail* won the Paladin Award as the best article to appear in *Montana The Magazine of Western History*. His 1995 essay "Showdown at the Hollywood Corral: Wyatt Earp in the Movies," received the Western Heritage Award from the National Cowboy Hall of Fame as the best article of the year.

Hutton is the editor of *Soldiers West* and

*The Custer Reader*, which received the John M. Carroll Literary Award from the Little Big Horn Associates. In 1988, he was the Mead Distinguished Research Fellow in American history at the Huntington Library.

He recently completed a screenplay on Davy Crockett for Columbia Pictures. He has appeared in or narrated more than 50 television documentaries on A&E, Disney and CBS, among others.
