A CARNIVAL sponsored by the Student Senate will begin in the evening behind Centennial Hall.

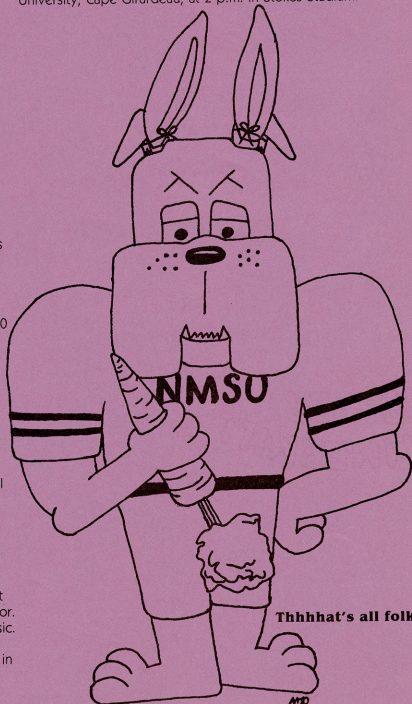
SATURDAY:
