REGISTRATION for the fall semester is from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. today in the registration hallway on the first floor of the Administration/Humanities Building. The late registration fee is waived today only. Students enrolling after today will pay the late fee. The last digit of the student's Social Security number determines the entry time to the registration hallway:

LATE REGISTRATION and free add/drop will begin from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday and continue through Friday, Aug. 30. Late registrants can carry no more than 14 hours. They will be accepted into only those classes in which the instructor feels that the student can make up any work missed. The 14-hour maximum load limit can be waived with permission from the Dean of Instruction's Office.

STUDENTS WHO HAVE prepaid their fees and housing in full for the first month may wait until the second week of classes to claim their aid. Students missing their scheduled time may come to the Business Office; however, aid not claimed by Sept. 6, will be cancelled.

STUDENTS PAYING FEES with bank loans, private scholarships, cash or check, should go to the Cashier's Window by 4 p.m. Friday, Aug. 30.

FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS, with the exception of students receiving bank loans and scholarships, should go to the tables near the Business Office, 105 Administration/Humanities Building, by 4 p.m. Friday, Aug. 30. Students must pay their first full tuition and fees installment at that time. If students are unable to meet this deadline for the first full installment, they need to go to the Business Office before Friday to request a deferment of fees. Financial aid recipients must personally visit the Business Office to sign the appropriate forms in order to have the aid applied toward tuition and fees. Students may sign for their aid according to the last digit of their Social Security number:

MEET THE PRESIDENTS at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. An ensemble from NMSU's Franklin Street Singers will perform at the assembly.

NEW STUDENT WELCOME PICNIC is scheduled from 6 to 7:30 p.m. Sunday, in Red Barn Park. All faculty and staff members are invited to attend. Free tickets for faculty and staff will be available at the park.

THE VALIDINE SYSTEM is used for admittance to residence hall dining. Students who have not had their ID picture taken for the Validine card can have it taken today at the Food Service Office in the Student Union Building and during mealtimes Saturday and Sunday in their residence halls.

THE PAINT SHOP will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. today and noon to 4 p.m. Saturday. The regular hours, 2 to 4 p.m. Mondays and Thursdays, will resume after next week. The Paint Shop is located in the basement of Blanton Hall on the southeast side.

A WELCOME DANCE will be held from 7:30 to 10 p.m. Monday, on the Student Union Mall (near the fountain). The dance is free and is sponsored by the Student Activities Board. Prizes will be awarded throughout the evening. In case of bad weather, the dance will be moved to Kirk Gym.

THE BEST DEAL ON CAMPUS, the Student Activities Board sticker, costs students, faculty and staff \$10 and can save them more than \$70 throughout the academic year. The sticker provides the holder with free admission to SAB Friday night movies and discounts on weekend excursions, concerts, spring break trips and other entertainment sponsored by the Student Activities Board. The stickers will be on sale beginning Monday in the SAB Office on the main concourse of the Student Union Building.

THE VETERANS CLUB BOOK SALE is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Activities Room of the Student Union Building. All students can buy and sell used books at the sale. Books will be accepted Monday and Tuesday; sold Tuesday through Thursday; and money and/or books returned Thursday and Friday. The club sells the books on a 15 percent consignment basis. THE SNACK BAR in the Student Union Building will be open this fall from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturdays and 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Sundays.

THE GAMES ROOM hours for fall are from 9:30 a.m. to 10 p.m. Sundays through Saturdays and 9:30 a.m. to 11 p.m. Saturdays. The Games Room is located on the first floor of the Student Union Building.

PICKLER MEMORIAL LIBRARY will be open during the following hours for the fall semester. These hours are subject to change preceding and during breaks and vacations. Regular hours are from 8 a.m. to midnight Mondays through Thursdays, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturdays and 1 p.m. to midnight Sundays.

THE CAMPUS BOOKSTORE will extend its hours during the first week of classes. The bookstore will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday. After the first week, the bookstore will keep its regular hours, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays and 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturdays.

SORORITY RUSH will begin with a question-and-answer forum at 7 p.m. Wednesday, in Centennial Hall Lounge. Interested women may register for rush at this time. An all-Greek torch walk begins at 8:30 p.m. Thursday, in front of Brewer Hall for all interested participants. Watch the **Northeast Today** for more rush information.

THE ACTIVITIES FAIR provides an opportunity for both new and returning students to explore the many organizations on campus. The event is co-sponsored annually by Cardinal Key national honor sorority and the Student Activities Office. The Fair is set from 7:30 to 10:30 p.m., Sept. 19, in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building.

TENNIS COURTS for free play are located south of Campbell Apartments and behind Pershing Arena. Varsity practice, intramural competition and other special scheduled events take precedence over general student use.

ALL MOTOR VEHICLES, including two- and three-wheeled motorcycles, must be registered with the University if they will be parked on University-owned grounds or streets between 7 a.m. Mondays through 5 p.m. Fridays. A parking sticker costs only \$7 for the 1985-86 academic year. Students should register and pay for their permit at the Business Office within 48 hours of enrollment. Faculty and staff may pick up stickers in the Safety and Security Office. License plate numbers and driver's license numbers are required for registration.
