WASHINGTON DURING THE INTERIM ... The University is offering a travel workshop to Washington, D.C. during the spring interim session. Jim Przybylski and Ron Coan of the Political Science department are the directors. The workshop will leave Kirksville by bus on Tuesday, May 24, and return Saturday, June 4. The bus will make intermediate stops in Chicago, Buffalo, Boston, and New York City. Among the sites to be visited are Lincoln's home in Springfield, Ill., the Tut exhibit in Chicago, Niagara Falls, various Revolutionary era sites in Boston, the United Nations complex, and the NBC Studios in New York. Also included on the stops are Gettysburg National Military Park, Independence Square in Philadelphia, the National Capitol, Mount Vernon, Arlington National Cemetery, the Supreme Court Chambers, and the White House.

Travel costs will be \$175 (includes transportation, lodging -- 3 per room -- and necessary entrance fees.) If taken for credit add tuition costs and \$10 workshop fee. A downpayment of \$25 must be made by March 25. More information in future issues of Northeast Today.
