## NORTHEAST NOTES

**Dr. Michael L. Lockhart**, Science, recently presented a talk at the national meeting of the American Society for Microbiology in New Orleans, La. The talk dealt with the effects of a common cancer causing chemical on genetic material. It was entitled "DNA Repair and DNA Synthesis In Vivo on Simian Virus 40 DNA Containing Benzo-a-pyrene Adducts." In addition, three other articles have been recently published in the publications, Mutation Research, Chemo-Biological Interactions and Carcinogenesis.

**Matt Eichor**, Science, presented a lecture at Kirksville Osteopathic Health Center entitled "Public Health in Your Practice-Nuclear Energy and Radiation Physiologically."

**Brenda Clark**, senior advertising design major, has been accepted to exhibit an illustration of her grandfather in the National Society of Illustrators Competition Exhibition in New York, N.Y. Fewer than 200 entries were selected from more than 4,000 submitted by art students around the U.S. The exhibition will be on display in the Society's Museum of American Illustration in New York from May 2-19. The artwork selected for the exhibition will also be reproduced in a catalog.

**Jim Barnes**, Language and Literature, had his book of poetry entitled "The American Book of the Dead" selected by the 34th annual Chicago Book Clinic to be honored in a display. The display of notable books will open on the SS Clipper docked at Navy Pier on June 7 and will remain on exhibit at the Ryder Gallery until July 5. Afterwards, it goes on tour. Barnes' book recently received "Honorable Mention" in the 1983 Before Columbus Foundation's achievement awards. In addition, the Association of American University Presses has selected Barnes' book to be one of its annual examples of fine printing. Barnes will be reading his poetry at the University of Missouri-Kansas City on April 18, during the annual literary festival on the Kansas City campus.
