

Friesen named Young Achiever

The Missouri Home Economics Association selected Carol Friesen as Missouri's Young Achiever. The award is presented annually to a Missouri home economist under 30 years of age who has contributed in some outstanding way to that profession. The state-level recipient is then submitted at the national level to compete for one of 10 American Home Economics Association Young Achievers awards.

Friesen, an instructor of foods and nutrition in Home Economics, has served on the MHEA's Executive Board since 1980. She was MHEA's State Student Member Section Adviser for one year and the local SMS-MHEA chapter adviser for four years. Friesen held the State Nutrition Section Chair for four years as well. She also served as a delegate selection committee member to the AHEA.

Perhaps one of the greatest factors responsible for her receiving the award has been her efforts to incorporate computers in home economics. Friesen has created and used a variety of software for the Apple and Commodore computers. "I use computers the most," Friesen said, "for diet analysis." In addition, she has incorporated health assessment software into her nutrition courses on campus. Friesen also gives micro-computer workshops around the state, particularly for home economics educators.

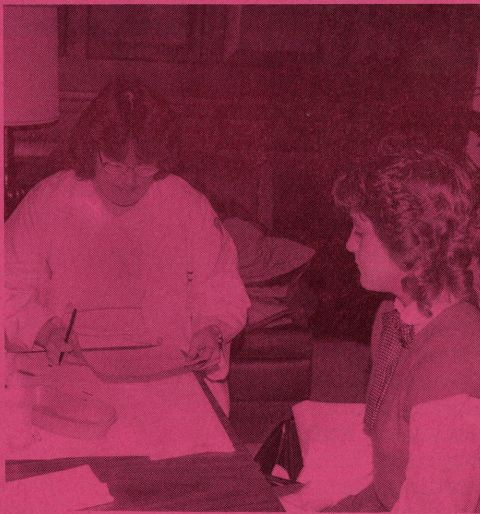
Recently, Friesen created a course aimed primarily at teaching educators how to incorporate computers in

the classroom. Her main goal in her involvement with computers, Friesen said, comes down to one idea.

Friesen said, "Any time people can delegate work to a computer, they

are adding value to their life."
