THE PRACTICE SESSION for graduates who will participate in Spring Commencement on May 9 will be at 11:30 a.m. Thursday in Baldwin Auditorium. Hometown news release forms will be available. They are to be submitted by May 9 to the Public Relations Office, McKinney Center. Releases will be mailed following Commencement.

ACCEPTANCE FORMS for students who have applied for summer financial aid must be signed soon to insure that the aid will be ready by May 30. The forms may be signed at the Financial Aids Office, 100 Administration/Humanities Building. The deadline for financial aid application for the 1980-81 academic year is June 1.

MINI-COMMENCEMENT will be held at 8 p.m. Friday in Baldwin Auditorium. Dr. Jack Reiske, professor of education, will be guest speaker. The ceremony recognizes students receiving one- and two-year certificates. Students participating in the Mini-Commencement and wishing to send this news to their hometown newspapers should pick up a news release form at the McKinney Center. Students wanting to have their photographs printed along with the news should attach a picture to the release form and turn it in to McKinney Center by May 2.

HIGH SCHOOL JOURNALISM DAY will bring more than 250 students from Missouri, Illinois and Iowa to campus on Wednesday. The second annual event is sponsored by the NMSU Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists, Sigma Delta Chi, and by the Language and Literature Division.

Bicycles with "snap-on" front wheels should be secured by the frame. 3) Students should check on their bike frequently and not leave it on campus during break periods.
