SATURDAY AND EVENING CLASSES begin this Saturday, August 28. Approximately 100 graduate and undergraduate courses are being offered this semester. Registration may be completed at the first class meeting.

Monday evening classes begin Aug. 30, Tuesday evening -- Aug. 31, Wednesday evening -- Sept. 1, Thursday evening -- Sept. 2 and Friday evening -- Sept. 3. All evening classes begin at 7 p.m. and Saturday classes begin at 8 a.m. unless otherwise stated.

There will be no registration on the second week of Saturday and evening classes. Late registrants will receive a mail-in form which must be completed and mailed to the Registrar's Office by Sept. 10 with the approximate fees in order to be enrolled.

THE SWINE FLU vaccine will be given to University faculty, staff and students on November 12 in Pershing Arena. The Missouri State Department of Health, with the aid of volunteer help, will administer the inoculations using the "pressure gun" method. Anyone younger than 21 must have parental consent before receiving the immunization, according to Dr. John Biggerstaff, director of the Student Clinic.

Kirksville area residents will receive the inoculations the following day at a location in Kirksville to be announced later.
