THE BOARD OF REGENTS of Northeast Missouri State University will hold its regular monthly meeting at 10:30 a.m. Friday in the President's Office/Board Room of the Administration/Humanities Building.

THE MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM will host the University of Minnesota-Duluth at 7:30 tonight in Pershing Arena. Admission is free with an NMSU ID, \$1 for a public school age child and \$2 for adults.

BRIG. GEN. ROBERT ARTER, deputy commander of Fort Leavenworth, Kan., will be the guest speaker at the Fall Commissioning Ceremony at 1:30 p.m. Friday in the Alumni Room of the Student Union Building. Brig. Gen. Arter also will commission four ROTC cadets as second lieutenants at the ceremony. The cadets, all seniors, are Larry Burriss of Monroe City; Steve Carden of St. Louis; Jim Towe of Willingboro, N.J.; and Dave Vincent of Kirksville.

Matt Eichor, Law Enforcement and Corrections, recently participated in the sixth annual National Symposium on Crime Laboratory Development in Quantico, Va. He was invited with more than 200 other laboratory officials by the Federal Bureau of Investigation to attend the symposium.
