The first copy of a student's transcript will be provided free of charge; each copy thereafter costs \$1. This new policy eliminates the issuance of transcripts free to graduates of NMSU. Students requesting a transcript should not expect the transcript to be ready in less than three days.

A RETIREMENT RECEPTION for Alvis Mason, carpenter supervisor in Maintenance Division, will be from 2-4 p.m. Thursday in the Alumni Room of the Student Union Building. He is retiring on Oct. 3 after 18 years of service to the University. Everyone is invited to attend to wish him well.

APPLICATIONS FOR WHO'S WHO are now being accepted in the Student Activities Office, 204 Administration/Humanities Building. A student must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 and have displayed leadership qualities throughout participation in academic and extra-curricular activities. A student must have enough hours now to indicate that he will be graduated no later than summer 1978 in order to apply. Application forms may be picked up at the Student Activities Office and must be returned by Oct. 12 to be eligible for consideration.

INQUIRIES ABOUT DANFORTH GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS should be directed to the Dean of Instruction's office, 203 Administration/Humanities Building. The fellowships are awarded to students who are seniors who have not undertaken graduate-level programs of study beyond their college-level work, planning to study for a Ph.D. in a liberal arts field, and having a serious interest in careers of teaching in colleges and universities. The Foundation is currently making a special effort to bring qualified persons from the racial and ethnic minorities into the profession of teaching. Interested students should apply before Oct. 21. Post-baccalaureate fellowships are also available and students can pick up information on those at the Dean of Instruction's Office.
