SPRING PRE-REGISTRATION will be held today through Dec. 2 in the registration hallway of the Administration/Humanities Building. Before entering the registration area, make sure 1) All financial obligations to the University are cleared; 2) Required freshman and sophomore tests have been completed; 3) Alternate courses are listed on Permit to Enroll; 4) Permit is completed (name, Social Security Number, term, major, adviser and student signature) and bottom, hard copy is clearly legible; 5) If you wish to enroll for 18 hours or more you must obtain the overload approval card from the Dean of Instruction before attempting to enroll.
