## Alumna Returns for Seminars

Dr. Phyllis Mullenix will conduct seminars for students and faculty on Tuesday. She will speak on "Effect of Selected Drugs on Development of the Brain," at 12:30 p.m., in the SUB Activities Room, for advanced students and faculty.

At 3:30 p.m., she will conduct an informal meeting on the topic of "Research Proposals," with faculty and research students, in Science Hall 274. The main seminar on "Neurobehavioral Toxicity Screening" will be held at 7 p.m., in the SUB Activities Room, for all science students. All three seminars are free and open to the public.

A native of Kirksville, Mullenix is a 1970 magna cum laude graduate of Northeast. She received a doctorate in pharmacology from the University of Kansas Medical Center, Kansas City, and did post-doctoral work in the area of environmental medicine at Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health in Baltimore, Md. She held a National Science Foundation Fellowship from 1970-74. She had a joint appointment from 1977-82 with the Department of Neuropathology of Harvard Medical School and the Department of Psychiatry of the Children's Hospital Medical Center,

both in Boston.

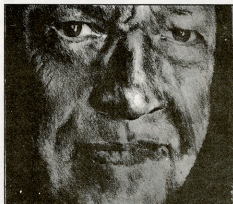
Presently, she holds a research appointment at the Forsyth Dental Center in Boston, and has a joint faculty appointment at Harvard and Northeastern universities.

The Forsyth Dental Center is a privately endowed research institute. Originally, Forsyth was a dental care infirmary for children. However, it has expanded its services to become the largest research center in the world for oral care.

Mullenix has been at the forefront in developing computer methods for neurobehavior toxicity screening at Forsyth. The basic premise of her research is aimed at scaling the functional output of the brain in relation to well known psychoactive drugs, toxic exposures or stereotaxic brain lesions. Her methodology also enables her lab to conduct preliminary assays of compounds that are of current concern to industrial and governmental groups.

Professionally, she belongs to the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the Society for Neurosciences.

Mullenix's seminars are part of the University's Science Seminar Series.
