A LIBRARY DISPLAY this month will feature items pertaining to the Bethel German Communal Colony located 48 miles northeast of Kirksville and founded in 1844. This is the only community west of the Mississippi River which has been placed in its entirety on the National Registry of Historic Places. This exhibit will place some emphasis on the role of the community in fiber arts, wool crafts, flax and wool processing, and sheep raising. The Bethel colony is receiving special recognition this year by serving as the site for the National Sheep Festival Sept. 7 (Labor Day).
