## Will Keim to speak to campus groups



The author of *The Education of Character: Lessons for Beginners* will speak to four groups on campus on Aug. 25. Will Keim delivers speeches that are precise in detail, persuasive in appeal, and passionate in delivery. It is his hope to impact his audience members in a positive way, challenge them, make them think and offer them a chance to laugh and reflect. He has spoken to more than 2 million students from 750 campuses across this country and Canada.

Keim will start the morning at 8 a.m. in the SUB Georgian Room with all student

athletes and coaches. At 11 a.m. in Baldwin Auditorium, he will make the presentation "Welcome to the Time of Your Life" to new students. A faculty and staff Welcome Back Luncheon (at noon in the SUB Georgian Room) will feature "The Education of Character," a presentation on working with students in higher education. His concluding presentation, "Community: How to Build It and Live It," will be made to the residence hall/college staffs at 1:30 p.m. in the SUB Activities Room. A book signing will be held from 2:30 to 3 p.m. at the Campus Bookstore in the SUB.

## Michael McManis to join Northeast community in September

Michael McManis, associate commissioner for planning and academic programs for the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education, has been named dean for planning and institutional development.

As the state's chief academic and planning officer for public and independent higher education, McManis provided leadership for academic affairs and institutional planning activities conducted by the CBHE.

"We are delighted to have someone of Michael's level of expertise," President Jack Magruder said. "His experience with the Coordinating Board for Higher Education will be of great value to our University."

McManis has served in a variety of roles for the CBHE since he joined the organization as associate director for academic affairs in 1981. Prior to his work with the CBHE, he was assistant to the president at

Bryant College and executive secretary and lecturer in the American Civilization Program at Brown University.

McManis received his bachelor's degree from Case Western Reserve University. He holds a master's degree in American history from Indiana University and a doctoral degree in American studies from Case Western Reserve.

At Northeast, McManis will work to enhance institutional effectiveness. He will help implement appropriate strategic planning processes that link the institution's mission and its fiscal capacity as well as promote the integration of planning-based decision-making throughout the University community.

"We will look to Michael, in a collaborative effort, to assist with planning and achieving our University goals," Magruder said. ☺
