GLEN TRACY, senior history education major, has been asked by President McClain to be the University's representative at the Eighth Annual Student Symposium in Reston, Va., April 15-17. Those attending the symposium will be welcomed by a White House reception and hear addresses by representatives of the Ford and Carter administrations on the subject of "National Leadership and Priorities for the Third Century." Both President Carter and former President Ford have indicated a desire to participate.

Representatives of the symposium were nominated on the basis of academic achievement, character and leadership.

COACHING CERTIFICATION (continued)... Preparation includes not only training in theory and techniques of a particular sport, but also encompasses a knowledge of human movement, exercise physiology, sport sociology, athletic administration, and prevention and care of athletic injuries. The program is based on recommendations established by the National Task Force on the Certification of High School Coaches and is aimed at ensuring the health and safety of the athlete.

Students interested in entering the program or obtaining further information should contact Bill Richerson, head of the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Division, ext. 7139. Students currently working toward coaching certification should officially enroll in the program through Richerson. A placement file will be kept on all students successfully completing certification requirements.
