For both poetry and fiction, the name, address and telephone number and the name of the work(s) should be included on a separate sheet. (3) Photographs should be black and white, 5x7 glossy prints. The photographer's name, address, telephone number and title(s) of the photo(s) should be included on a separate, clearly labeled attached sheet. Turn in submissions to the Windfall mailbox in the SUB. Accepted authors/photographers will be notified by mail and receive a complimentary copy of the published magazine at the end of the semester.
