The Alumni Banquet will be at 7 p.m. tomorrow in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building. A concert will be at 7 and 10 p.m. tomorrow in Baldwin Hall Auditorium. The concert will feature Dave Loggins and The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band. On Saturday, the parade will begin at 9 a.m. using the theme "The Wonderful World of Disney." A pre-game show will begin at 1 p.m. Saturday at Stokes Stadium. At 2 p.m. the Bulldogs will battle the Purple Aces from University of Evansville (Indiana). A free homecoming dance will be held at 8 p.m. Saturday in Kirk Gym.

TICKETS FOR THE ANNUAL ALUMNI BANQUET still are available in the Alumni Office, McKinney Center. The banquet will be at 7 p.m. tomorrow in the Georgian Room of the Student Union Building.
