NMSU Live tryouts will be held from 7-9 p.m., Dec. 2 and 3, SUB Activities Room.

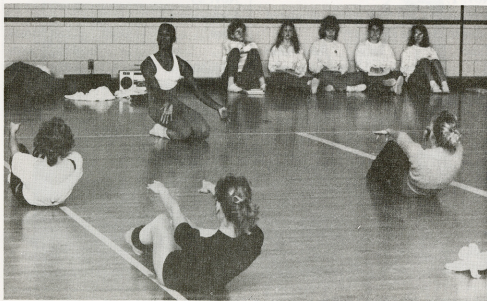

SAB Ski Night at Rainbow Basin will be held from noon-10 p.m., Dec. 4. The event was previously scheduled for Nov. 20.

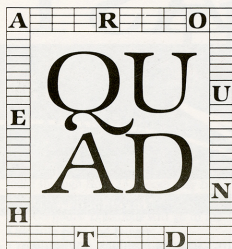

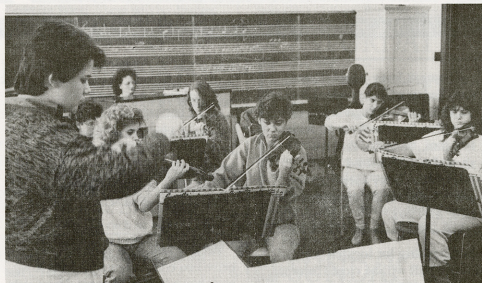

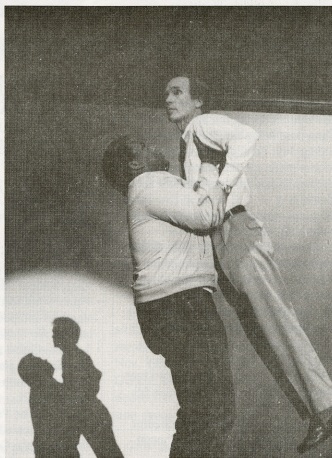
