

In an effort to provide financial assistance to deserving students, Northeast Missouri State University awards a number of endowed scholarships. These scholarships are made possible by the generous contributions of alumni and friends of the University.

All scholarships are awarded in the Spring to be used for the following academic year. Applications will be due in the Alumni/Development Office, McClain Hall 106, **no later than the close of business March 6, 1992.** Further information may be obtained through the Alumni Development Office, (816) 785-4133. (Note: All scholarship amounts are estimated and subject to Board approval.)

► **The Norvell C. Allen Agricultural Memorial Scholarship—\$350**

This scholarship was established in 1982 from the income earned on crops harvested over eight years from University properties. It was named for a man who served the University as an instructor of agriculture from 1937 through 1963. Before coming to NMSU, he taught at Kirksville High School for 10 years.

Criteria:

1. Natural-born U.S. citizen
2. Agricultural science major
3. Sophomore status
4. Minimum 3.0 GPA
5. Displays leadership abilities

► **Anonymously Endowed Scholarship—2/\$575**

Criteria:

1. United States citizen
2. Pursuing a degree in math, science (particularly physical sciences) or history
3. Minimum 2.5 GPA

► **The Olivene Baker Child Development Scholarship—\$150**

Founded by Olivene Baker ('66), her family, friends and former students upon her retirement in 1984. Baker started as director of the NMSU Child Development Lab in 1970. She later became an instructor within the Division of Family Sciences.

Criteria:

1. Child development major
2. Junior status or above
3. 3.0 minimum GPA

► **The Otho L. Barnett Memorial Scholarship—\$250**

Endowed by friends and relatives of Otho L. Barnett ('28). Barnett began his career at NMSU in 1939 as an instructor of industrial arts. He later became head of the Practical Arts Division in 1942, serving in that capacity until his retirement in 1968.

Criteria:

1. Industrial science education major with professional promise
2. Senior status
3. Minimum 2.5 GPA
4. Participant in school activities
5. Recommendation from the industrial science staff

► **The Berenice B. Beggs Memorial Scholarship—\$100**

Berenice B. Beggs ('22) served as an assistant professor of English at NMSU from 1926 until 1958. Beggs had several articles printed in educational magazines along with published poetry. This scholarship was initiated by friends of Beggs.

Criteria:

1. Pre-elementary education major
2. U.S. citizen
3. Junior status or higher
4. Must be enrolled in or have taken a children's literature course

► **The Dr. Clifton R. Bell Research Stipend—\$450**

This award was founded to honor a man who had spent 45 years in public education. Dr. Clifton Bell served as superintendent of schools at Farmington, Mo., and Galesburg, Ill., before coming to NMSU in 1964 as a professor of secondary education. He

remained in that position through his retirement in 1976.

Criteria:

1. Pursuing an education specialist degree (See the Education Division Office for more information)

► **Max E. Bell Scholarship—\$150**

This scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Max E. Bell who retired as professor of botany in 1991 from the NMSU Division of Science after 37 years of teaching.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding student
2. Majoring in plant science
3. Preference given to Alpha Phi Sigma members

► **The John D. Black Scholarship—\$600**

Established by friends in honor of Dr. John Black, a professor of zoology at NMSU from 1948 through 1973. He authored a book and several articles and is credited as being the first pre-osteopathic adviser in the country.

Criteria:

1. Science major
2. Junior status only
3. 3.5 minimum GPA

► **The Agnes Blackwood Scholarship—\$300**

Created by the late Lanus W. Madsen ('21) in June 1983 as a tribute to his sister-in-law, Agnes Blackwood Hardy ('35). She retired in 1972 after 42 years as a elementary school teacher in Shellbina, Mo. Mr. Madsen retired as a high school instructor and superintendent.

Criteria:

1. Pre-elementary education major
2. U.S. citizen and Missouri resident

3. Minimum 3.5 GPA
4. Ranked in upper half of high school class
5. Renewable with a 3.5 GPA

► **The Burdman Family Scholarships—2/\$525**

Initiated by Joe Burdman, who founded Burdman Auto Parts. Mr. Burdman's son, Col. Louis A. Burdman, is a 1940 graduate of NMSU.

Criteria:

1. Sophomore status
2. Outstanding student
3. Autobiography and faculty recommendation required

► **The Samuel Burk Scholarship—\$150**

Established in 1982 by Vera Burk in honor of her late husband, Samuel Burk. Mr. Burk served on the NMSU Board of Regents from 1973 through 1979, serving a year as president. Sam and Vera Burk founded Kirksville's KIRX and KRXL radio stations.

Criteria:

1. Interested in equestrian studies
2. Outstanding student

► **The Burroughs Corporation Scholarship—\$100**

This award was established in 1984 by the Burroughs Corporation.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding upperclass graphic arts major
2. Preference given to students with financial need

► **The Edna Millay Campbell Performing Arts Scholarship—\$150**

This award was established by friends and relatives of Edna Millay Campbell. She was the founder of the Edna

Campbell Bookstore and was also the longtime owner/manager of the University bookstore. Campbell was noted for being a strong supporter of the performing arts in Kirksville.

Criteria:

1. Completed 12 or more semester hours
2. Minimum 2.5 GPA
3. Demonstrate proficiency in one of the performing arts

▶ **The Frank & Mary Carter Mathematics Scholarship—\$500**

Established in 1991 by **Frank W. Carter ('47)**, in memory of his wife, **Mary B. Carter ('49)**.

Criteria:

1. Mathematics major accepted into MAE program
2. Financial need
3. Minimum 3.0 grade point average

▶ **The Bernice Humphrey Clark Vocal Music Scholarship—\$300**

This award was endowed in 1985 by **Bernice Humphrey Clark ('26)**. Clark was involved in education from graduation through her retirement in 1973, first as a music teacher, later as a principal and finally, as an elementary music supervisor.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding female vocal music major

▶ **The Aileen Corbin/Pi Kappa Delta Scholarship—\$850**

This scholarship was established in 1983 as a memorial to Aileen Corbin by her husband William N. Corbin. Mr. Corbin, who died in 1989, provided additional funding with a bequest of \$10,000. Mr. Corbin was retired from the Division of Language and Literature at NMSU.

Criteria:

1. Member of Pi Kappa Delta
2. Outstanding debater

▶ **The Clifton Cornwell Award for Achievement in Creative Writing—\$150**

Established in 1991 by **William L. Moore ('34)** in honor of his former professor, Clifton Cornwell, who served on the NMSU faculty from 1924-1945. This award will be made annually based on the following:

Criteria:

1. High creative ability in the art of writing
2. More information can be obtained through the Division of Language and Literature

▶ **The Donna Crawford Scholarship—\$500**

Established in memory of Donna Crawford by her husband, Don, and mother, Elsie Smith. Mrs. Crawford died in March 1982 after battling cancer. She had served as an instructor of French at NMSU from 1967 to 1982.

Criteria:

1. French major
2. U.S. citizen or working toward U.S. citizenship
3. Minimum 3.0 GPA
4. Renewable

▶ **The Jane Crow Scholarship—\$550**

Established in memory of **Jane Crow ('23)** by **Helen Miller ('48)**, who was touched by Crow's teaching. Crow served more than 28 years in Kirksville public schools as a supervisor-teacher, assistant principal and assistant director of guidance in the Junior High School.

Criteria:

1. Priority given to a handicapped student
2. Outstanding student

▶ **The Ronald K. Cullers Veterans Club Scholarship—\$250**

The Ronald K. Cullers Veterans Club was named after a 1965 graduate who was the first NMSU alum to die in the Vietnam War. The Veterans Club founded this award in 1985.

Criteria:

1. Parent must be an honorably discharged veteran of the U.S. armed forces (Documentation must be submitted)
2. A resident of northern Missouri or southern Iowa
3. Demonstrate financial need
4. Renewable in cases of extreme financial need

▶ **The Durward De Witt Scholarship—2/\$550**

This scholarship was made possible by a gift from **Durward G. De Witt ('25)**. Following graduation, De Witt worked as a teacher, superintendent and later co-founded the Glow Candle Company in Kansas City, Mo.

Criteria:

1. Natural-born U.S. citizen
2. Missouri resident
3. Involved with FFA, FHA or 4-H
4. Minimum 2.0 GPA
5. Renewable with a 2.0 GPA

▶ **The Delta Sigma Pi/Tina Schmidt Memorial Scholarship—\$550**

The Iota Nu Chapter of Delta Sigma Pi professional business fraternity founded this award in 1983. The scholarship was named in honor of an

undergraduate member who was killed in a horse-riding accident.

Criteria:

1. Accounting, business administration or business education major
2. Completed a minimum of 45 semester hours by the beginning of the spring semester
3. Minimum 3.2 GPA
4. Cannot be a member of Delta Sigma Pi
5. Must not be receiving any other academic scholarship

▶ **The Grace Devitt Nursing Scholarship—\$250**

This scholarship was endowed by friends to honor the first division head of nursing since it was established as a separate division in 1971. By the time she retired in 1982, Dr. Grace Devitt led the Division to a nationally recognized, fully accredited program.

Criteria:

1. Essay contest between top five students of the junior class (More information is available through the Nursing Division Office)

▶ **The James M. & Robert G. Dillinger Memorial Scholarship—\$350**

Initiated by the family of **James M. ('20)** and **Robert G. ('58)** Dillinger after their deaths in 1969. The elder Dillinger, James, taught music at Hannibal-LaGrange College and in the Hannibal public schools for more than 25 years. His son, Robert, taught school music for 10 years in northwest Missouri.

Criteria:

1. Pre-music education major (upperclass student) or graduate music education major
2. Minimum 2.5 GPA
3. Display sincerity, talent and good citizenship

▶ **The Lucille Dillinger Woman Band Director Scholarship—\$100**

This scholarship was established in 1984 by **Lucille Dillinger Alexander ('42)**. Alexander has served as a band director and chairman of the Women Band Directors National Association. She has participated in band directing for more than 35 years.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding female student
2. Pursuing a career in band directing

▶ **The Joseph P. Dolan Living Memorial Scholarship—\$400**

Dr. Joseph P. Dolan was head of the Division of Health and Exercise Science from 1961 until his death in 1974. This scholarship was developed by family and friends at that time.

Criteria:

1. Health and exercise science major
2. Junior status or above
3. Outstanding student
4. Minimum 3.0 GPA
5. Desire to teach in public schools

▶ **The James J. Dougherty Scholarship—\$150**

This award was established through the contributions of friends, relatives and his wife, **Marie Wheatcraft Dougherty ('33)**. **James Dougherty ('33)** retired as NMSU athletic director in 1974 after 12 years in that capacity and eight years as football coach.

Criteria:

1. Priority given to an athlete or physical education major
2. Outstanding student

▶ **The Dvorak Journalism Scholarship—\$100**

The Society of Professional Journalists/Sigma Delta Chi established this scholarship to honor former mass communications instructor Jack Dvorak.

Criteria:

1. Incoming freshman
2. Pursuing a degree in communication

▶ **The Frank & Mildred Elsea Nursing Scholarship—\$200**

Established by **Dr. Robert ('50)** and **Rita Elsea** in memory of his parents. The scholarship was endowed for the Nursing Division because of the impression made by a nurse who cared for the elder Elseas during their illness.

Criteria:

1. Pursuing a degree in nursing
2. Sophomore status
3. Outstanding student
4. Applicants will be interviewed

▶ **The Sina Faye Fowler Memorial Scholarship—\$700**

Endowed by the estate of **Sina Faye Fowler ('27)** in 1970. Fowler served in military hospitals as a Second Lieutenant. She also worked as a dietitian for St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee, Ill., and for Western Electric Company.

Criteria:

1. Family sciences major with an area of concentration in foods and nutrition
2. Senior status
3. 3.0 minimum GPA
4. Student member of at least one professional organization

▶ **The William F. Hall Scholarship—\$250**

This award was endowed upon the retirement of Dr. William Hall in 1982. Hall came to NMSU in 1962 as a professor in speech pathology and director of the speech and hearing

clinic. In 1966, he became head of the Division of Special Programs and remained in that position through his retirement.

Criteria:
1. Senior status
2. Communication Disorders major
3. Excellence in academic achievement and professional promise.

- ▶ **The Hearst Scholarships**
Northwest received a \$50,000 grant from the William Randolph Hearst Foundation. A \$45,000 portion funds scholarships for art, music and theatre majors with financial need. The remaining \$5,000 funds a scholarship for communication majors.

- ▶ **The Jack W. Hines Memorial Scholarship**
-2/\$700

The family of Dr. Jack W. Hines established this scholarship in 1977 as a memorial to a man who served NMSU as an instructor of political science from 1968 through 1976.

Criteria:

2. Complete 45 hours of credit by the beginning of the spring semester
3. 3.0 minimum GPA
4. Demonstrate financial need
5. Two letters of recommendation (see Social Science Division Office)
6. Personal interview
7. Renewable with a 3.5 cumulative GPA

- ▶ **The V. Don Hudson Memorial Scholarship**
-2/\$525

This scholarship was initiated by Rose Hudson in memory of her late husband, V. Don Hudson ('27). As a child Don contracted polio and for the rest of his life he had trouble walking and was never without a limp. Hudson never let this obstacle deter him from his goals. That is why Rose Hudson established this scholarship to help a person, who due to a physical disability or other handicap, might not be able to achieve his or her educational goals without financial assistance.

- ▶ **The Dr. Arthur F. Humphreys Music Education Scholarship**

Upon his death in 1967, this scholarship was established by his brother,

Dr. Alfred W. Humphreys, other family and friends as a tribute to a man who spent the majority of his life as a music educator. Twenty of those years were spent in higher education, of which the last two were spent at NMSU as professor of music education.

2. Minimum 2.5 GPA
3. Display sincerity, talent and good citizenship

- ▶ **The James F. Jae Jr. Scholarship**
-1\$50

James Jae served as a member of the NMSU Board of Regents from 1970 to 1973. Jae was the general manager and vice president of KHMO radio in Hannibal, Mo. The scholarship was started through the contributions of friends and relatives.

Criteria:
1. Natural-born U.S. citizen
2. Sophomore status or higher
3. Minimum 2.0 GPA
4. Renewable with a 2.0 GPA

- ▶ **The Juanita McGuire Jamison Memorial Scholarships**
-2/\$625

These scholarships were endowed by the estate of Juanita McGuire Jamison ('13) in 1974. Jamison taught art and music in public schools for 10 years before becoming a private instructor of the pipe organ.

- ▶ **The Edward D. Jones & Company Scholarship**

This scholarship was initiated in 1977 by Edward D. Jones and Company.

4. Show strong campus leadership
5. Written faculty recommendation

- ▶ **The Max Kade Scholarship**

The Max Kade Foundation of New York issued a \$10,000 grant to establish a scholarship in German.

- ▶ **The Richard M. Keith Memorial Scholarship**
-1\$100

Dr. Richard Keith was a veterinarian in the Kirksville area from 1949 through his death in 1984. In 1975, Keith assumed a position as NMSU's director of Animal Health Technology, which he held for nine years. This scholarship was established as a memorial by friends and relatives of Keith.

- ▶ **The Foreste Ross Kimbley Scholarship**
-2\$50

Foreste Ross Kimbley established this scholarship in 1986 after witnessing the benefits of her husband's, Wilbur P. Kimbley II ('28), scholarship.

Criteria:
1. Outstanding pre-med or pre-vet student

- ▶ **The Wilbur Kimbley II Scholarship**
-3\$00

Wilbur Kimbley II ('28) endowed this scholarship in 1982. Kimbley retired after 40 years as a school superintendent and teacher.

Criteria:
1. Priority given to students from Sullivan or Knox counties
2. Pursuing a degree in business education or industrial sciences

- ▶ **The W. Boyd King Memorial Scholarship**

This scholarship was established in 1990 in memory of W. Boyd King, former NMSU head basketball coach. He retired from this position in 1971, after 25 years of service. King continued to teach until 1977, when he retired with emeritus status.

- ▶ **The Kirchberger Scholarship**

This scholarship was established by Dr. Frederic Kirchberger and his friends in 1983. Kirchberger came to Northeast in 1951 and taught music for 32 years before retiring.

3. Demonstrate strong keyboard skills (See Fine Arts Division Office)

- ▶ **The Dr. William Kitts Memorial Scholarship**

Friends and relatives have memorialized Dr. William Kitts through a scholarship endowed in 1983. Kitts

came to NMSU in 1966 and served as associate professor of social science education through his retirement in 1978.

- ▶ **The William T. Krueger Scholarship**

Established in 1987, this scholarship was formed by family and friends as a memorial for William T. Krueger. Krueger was the father of Darrell W. Krueger who served as dean of instruction at NMSU from 1971-1989.

- ▶ **The Dean Earl & Edna Ludlow Scholarships**
-3/\$500

Earl and Edna Ludlow established scholarships in the areas of business administration, education administration and math and computer science in 1982. Mr. Ludlow worked as a high school teacher, principal and superintendent covering a span of 20 years. He came to NMSU in 1964 and served as professor of education and dean of instruction.

- ▶ **The Erlene Blackwood Madsen Scholarship**

The late Lanuis W. Madsen ('21) established this award in 1983 as memorial to his wife, Erlene Blackwood Madsen ('32). Mrs. Madsen taught business classes in Quincy, Ill., for most of her life. Mr. Madsen retired as a high school teacher and superintendent.

2. Business major
3. Minimum 3.5 GPA
4. Ranked in upper half of high school class
5. Renewable with a 3.5 minimum GPA

- ▶ **The Alpha C. Mayfield Music Scholarship**
-2\$50

Dr. Alpha C. Mayfield ('87) bequeathed \$5,000 in 1987 to establish this scholarship. Mayfield was

involved in music education for more than 45 years.

Criteria:

1. Must be working toward a master's degree in music education
2. Based on talent and financial need

▶ **The Martha McClaskey Humanities Scholarship—\$400**

Founded in memory of **Martha Jones McClaskey ('49)**, an instructor of English at NMSU from 1959 to 1978. Prior to her work at Northeast, she taught English at Milan High School and Kirksville Junior High School.

Criteria:

1. Majoring in humanities or displaying an interest in the humanities
2. Minimum 3.0 GPA
3. Potential shown for developing into a contributing, responsible, moral citizen

▶ **The George & Stacy McGuire Scholarship—\$200**

Established in 1963 as a gift from the estate of Ivie A. MacCarthy. Given as a memorial to her parents, George and Stacy McGuire.

Criteria:

1. Upperclassman
2. Pursuing a degree in art or philosophy

▶ **The Colonel Robert L. McKinney Memorial Scholarship—\$550**

Col. Robert McKinney ('36) served NMSU for more than 30 years in the capacity of assistant to the president and head of public relations. This scholarship was made possible through the gifts of friends and relatives.

Criteria:

1. Born and raised in Missouri
2. Sophomore status or higher
3. Minimum 2.5 GPA
4. Renewable with a minimum 2.5 GPA

▶ **The Robin Meyerkord Memorial Scholarship—\$200**

Established in 1986 by family, Alpha Sigma Alpha sorority and Alpha Kappa Lambda fraternity in memory of Robin Meyerkord after her tragic death in a car accident. Meyerkord was the 1986 Greek Week Queen representing Alpha Sigma Alpha.

Criteria:

1. One award is presented to Alpha Sigma Alpha's Greek Week Queen candidate; one award is presented to Alpha Kappa Lambda's Greek Week King candidate

▶ **The Joseph Mitch Memorial Scholarship—\$600**

Bonnie Skinner Mitch ('58) established this award in 1980 to honor her husband, **Joseph ('57)**. Mr. Mitch was involved in education from graduation until his death in 1976. He served as a principal, Moberly Junior College instructor and associate professor of accounting at NMSU.

Criteria:

1. Accounting major with at least six hours of accounting
2. Minimum 2.5 GPA in accounting and overall

▶ **The Chandler Monroe Memorial Scholarship—\$150**

This award was established in memory of Chandler Monroe by his family and friends. Prof. Monroe was a member of the NMSU faculty from 1960-1990. After this 30-year tenure at NMSU, he retired as professor emeritus of speech. In 1990 Prof. Monroe was named NMSU Educator of the Year.

Criteria:

1. Junior status or higher
2. Language and Literature major
3. Consideration given to students with an interest in teaching

▶ **The Dr. Roland Nagel Scholarship—\$250**

Dr. Roland Nagel ('43) followed Otto Barnett as head of the Industrial Science Division, occupying that position through his retirement in 1985, at which time this award was founded by his former students, friends and family.

Criteria:

1. Undergraduate or graduate student pursuing a degree in industrial education, industrial technology or industrial management
2. Minimum 3.0 GPA
3. Display leadership in university and community affairs

▶ **Nursing Alumni Scholarship—\$250**

Established in 1991 by the Nursing faculty on Northeast Missouri State University.

Criteria:

1. Nursing major after completion of NU330-335
2. GPA of 3.0 or above
3. Demonstration of campus and/or community service

▶ **The Dorothy Pearson Scholarship—\$200**

This award was established by former students and friends of **Dorothy Pearson ('28)**. Pearson was a high school and a college instructor of home economics as well as being the head of the Division of Home Economics from 1953 to 1972.

Criteria:

1. Majoring in an area of family sciences
2. Minimum 2.5 GPA

▶ **The Dr. Robert Peavler Memorial Scholarship—\$600**

This award was established in 1983 by family and friends with significant contributions from his daughter Emily Gross. Peavler served as a professor of physics at NMSU from 1964-1983.

Criteria:

1. Physics major
2. Junior status or above
3. Minimum 2.8 GPA

▶ **The Sarah Wimp Peavler Scholarship—\$250**

This award was endowed by friends and relatives of **Sarah Wimp Peavler ('29)**. Peavler began teaching at NMSU in 1958 as assistant professor of health. In 1960, she was charged by President Ryle with the responsibility of re-establishing the nursing program at the University and served as head of the Division through 1970.

Criteria:

1. Nursing major
2. Natural-born U.S. citizen
3. Sophomore status or higher
4. Minimum 2.5 GPA
5. Renewable with a 2.5 GPA
6. Financial need must be demonstrated

▶ **The George S. Preisack Jr. Memorial Scholarship—\$200**

This scholarship was established by family and friends in 1987 as a memorial to George S. Preisack Jr. Preisack's daughter Lynne and son Jeff graduated from Northeast in 1984 and 1988, respectively.

Criteria:

1. U.S. citizen
2. Missouri resident
3. 3.0 cumulative GPA
4. Upper one-third of high school class
5. Chemistry, English or fine arts major

▶ **The Vincent Price Theatrical Performance Scholarship—\$300**

Vincent Price, an internationally known actor, established this award in 1984. Price has performed at NMSU more than any other college or university in the country.

Criteria:

1. Selection will be based entirely upon the acting skills, ability and artistry as displayed in public performance done under the management of the NMSU Theatre Department. The selection may not necessarily be made on the basis of a single performance but on

the cumulative effect of any number of qualifying performances

2. Second-semester freshman status or above

▶ **The Noah P. Richardson Scholarship—\$200**

This award was established by family and friends after his death in 1986. **Noah Richardson ('38)** retired from NMSU in 1974 after more than 40 years with the title director emeritus of independent studies.

Criteria:

1. Applicant must be entering the MAE program
2. B.A. in history or political science

▶ **The Dr. Wray & Helen Rieger Memorial Scholarship—\$950**

This scholarship was initiated by friends and relatives of Dr. and Mrs. Wray Rieger. Dr. Rieger began his career at NMSU in 1926 as an organic chemistry instructor. He became head of the Division of Science in 1945 and dean of instruction in 1960. He retired in 1972. Helen Rieger served as the curator of the University museum for more than 21 years and was also the archivist from 1965 to 1977.

Criteria:

1. Science major
2. Junior status only
3. Minimum 3.5 GPA

▶ **The Ray Roberts Memorial Scholarship—\$450**

Endowed in 1981 by **Henry ('39) and Harriett Sensesich ('43) Roberts** as a memorial to his brother, **Dr. Ray Roberts ('40)**. Ray Roberts served in several positions within the Naval Department and the Postal Service, covering a period of more than 33 years. Henry Roberts is retired from Owens-Corning Fiberglass as chief chemist.

Criteria:

1. Majoring in a foreign language or English (priority given to French majors)
2. U.S. citizen
3. Minimum 2.0 GPA
4. Special consideration given to students seeking a career in public service

▶ **The Willard Roberts Scholarship—\$300**

Alma Ullom established this scholarship in 1986 in memory of her youngest brother, Willard Wayne Roberts. Roberts attended NMSU for one year before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force. He was killed in World War II.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding chemistry, physics or math major
2. May not hold another significant scholarship

▶ **The Ryle Hall Scholarship—\$100**

Established in 1979 by the Ryle Hall Council.

Criteria:

1. Live in Ryle Hall for two consecutive semesters preceding the time of application
2. Minimum 2.5 GPA
3. Must have demonstrated leadership and service to Ryle Hall
4. Must demonstrate exemplary behavior on and off campus

▶ **The Walter & Maurine Ryle Scholarship—\$2/\$600**

Dr. Walter ('16) and Maurine ('29) Ryle have had their names memorialized through the contributions of friends, relatives and former students. Dr. Ryle was the University's seventh president and is noted for having the longest tenure in the office serving from 1937 to 1967.

Criteria:

1. Pursuing a degree in an area of teacher education
2. Renewable with a minimum 3.5 GPA

▶ **The Dr. Paul Owen Selby Memorial Scholarship—\$700**

This scholarship was originally founded by **Dr. P. O. Selby ('11)** and has since been enhanced by friends and former students. Selby's educational career spanned more than 50 years, of which a majority was spent as a professor of business, head of the department of business education and dean of instruction at NMSU.

Criteria:

1. Business education major
2. Junior status or higher
3. Minimum 2.75 GPA

▶ **The Sevens/Srnka Scholarship—\$2/1000**

This scholarship was created in 1991 through gifts made in honor of Dr. James G. Sevens who retired as professor of dramatics after 32 years of service, and **Alfred H. Srnka ('60)** who retired as assistant professor of dramatics with 30 years of service.

Criteria:

1. Theatre major
2. Excellence in theatre practice
3. Excellence in theatre studies

▶ **The Dr. Eugene W. Smith Memorial Scholarship—\$200**

Friends and relatives founded this award in 1980 as a tribute to **Dr. Eugene W. Smith ('35)**. Smith worked as a high school principal and a research associate at the University of Virginia before coming to NMSU. He retired in 1978 as assistant professor

emeritus of physics, after serving 23 years in that capacity.

Criteria:

1. Physics major
2. Junior status only
3. 3.5 minimum GPA

▶ **The James W. Sparks Scholarship—\$400**

Following his sudden death in 1979, friends and relatives founded this award in memory of **James W. Sparks ('57)**. Sparks began as a speech therapist at Sigourney High School in Iowa. He came to the University in 1963 and served as an assistant professor of speech pathology through 1979.

Criteria:

1. Junior status
2. Communication Disorders major
3. Excellence in academic achievement and professional promise

▶ **Harold & Helen Stewart Memorial Scholarship—\$250**

This scholarship was established by Miles and Nancy Lovelace and friends in honor of Nancy's parents, Harold and Helen Stewart. The intent of this scholarship is to enable students to attend Northeast who would financially be unable to attend otherwise.

Criteria:

1. Admitted to MAE program
2. 3.0 grade point average
3. Financial need

▶ **The Barrett & Mae Stout Voice-Choral Scholarship—\$700**

Endowed in 1980, this scholarship was founded by **Dr. Kemble ('36)** and **Mildred ('37) Stout** in memory of his parents. Dr. Barrett and Mae Stout were 1915 and 1929 NMSU graduates, respectively. Barrett Stout served as an associate professor of music at NMSU for 15 years. Dr. Kemble Stout is professor emeritus of music and former music department chairman of Washington State University.

Criteria:

1. Undergraduate music major or prospective music major
2. Outstanding student specializing in an area of voice or choral music

▶ **The Kathleen Strickler Scholarship—\$450**

Established in 1986 by family, friends and her husband, Howard C. Strickler as a memorial to Kathleen Strickler. Strickler had served at Northeast for more than 40 years in a number of positions serving last as director of Career Planning and Placement.

Criteria:

1. Applicant must be entering the MAE program

▶ **The Thomas Family Nursing Scholarship—\$200**

This scholarship was created through the generous gifts of Jim and Rita Thomas. Rita Thomas is a registered nurse and is a graduate of St. Mary's class of 1954. Dr. Thomas is professor of English at Northeast.

Criteria:

1. Nursing major
2. Junior or Senior Status

▶ **The William Unger Memorial Scholarship—\$150**

The year 1980 marked the founding of this award, initiated by family and friends of Dr. William Unger upon his death. Unger came to the United States after World War II and eventually to NMSU as professor of art in 1960. He was granted the title of professor emeritus of art in 1979.

Criteria:

1. Art major
2. Minimum 3.0 GPA
3. Display excellent studio skills (see Fine Arts Division Office)

▶ **The Maurice E. Wade Scholarship—\$2/\$900**

This award was established in 1987 by C. Wesley Remington in honor of his former coach, **Maurice E. Wade ('52)**. Wade served as NMSU head football coach from 1952 until 1967. In 1985, he received the title of instructor emeritus of physical education.

Criteria:

1. Member of the varsity football team in their 9th or 10th semester with no varsity eligibility remaining

▶ **The Nan E. Wade/Cardinal Key Scholarship—\$400**

Established in 1956 in honor of Nan E. Wade, a retired faculty member and former Cardinal Key sponsor. Wade was a professor of Modern Language from 1929-1956 at Northeast.

Criteria:

1. Must meet the same requirements as for membership in Cardinal Key
2. Minimum 3.0 GPA
3. Financial need is an important factor

▶ **The Shirley Ann Watson Memorial Scholarship—\$3/\$650**

Established in 1989 by a \$30,000 bequest from the estate of Edna E. Watson Richard. This scholarship was made on behalf of Mrs. Richard and her late husband, John D. Watson, in memory of their daughter, Shirley Ann Watson ('70).

Criteria:

1. Natural-born U.S. citizen
2. Junior or Senior status
3. 3.0 GPA
4. Desire to teach

▶ **The Harry W. Williams Memorial Scholarship—\$150**

This scholarship was established in 1960 by students and friends. Harry Williams was involved in education for more than 35 years, working as a superintendent, principal and an instructor of mathematics. He served at NMSU as assistant professor of mathematics.

Criteria:

1. Outstanding student
2. Sophomore status or higher
3. Must have completed 10 hours of courses included in a mathematics degree (Not restricted to mathematics majors)

▶ **The Dale Woods Mathematics Scholarship—\$500**

The head of the Division of Mathematics and Computer Science since 1965, this scholarship was founded by friends to honor Woods on his retirement in 1982. He served NMSU for 23 years, initially as a temporary instructor of math.

Criteria:

1. Math or math education major, including undergraduate and graduate students
2. 75 semester hours or more must be completed prior to the beginning of the spring semester
3. Minimum 3.5 GPA in mathematics
4. Two faculty recommendations

▶ **The J.C. & Donna S. Wright Memorial Scholarship—\$150**

Originally endowed by Dr. James C. Wright and friends, this scholarship memorializes two people who devoted their lives to education. Dr. J. C. Wright served as a teacher, principal and superintendent in Iowa. He came to NMSU in 1965 and was a professor of education through his retirement in 1972. Donna Wright was an instructor of English at NMSU from 1965 to 1973.

Criteria:

1. Sophomore status only
2. Completed LL 100 English Comp. I and LL 170 Speech Communication with a minimum 3.0 GPA in those classes
3. Written autobiography must be submitted with application
